

Teacher Scholar Model Fall 2026 Implementation - FAQs DRAFT

The Teacher-Scholar Model embodies Learn by Doing by supporting faculty as active learners who integrate their research, scholarship, and creative work into teaching, creating a dynamic and student-centered learning environment. Beginning in Fall 2026 with semester conversion, Cal Poly will implement a new initiative that provides eligible tenure-line faculty with dedicated time to engage in the innovative and impactful scholarship that underpins the Teacher-Scholar Model.

The Teacher-Scholar Model program (TSM) is a professional development program that allocates three Weighted Teaching Units (WTUs) per academic year to each eligible tenure-line faculty member for assigned time dedicated to research, scholarship, and creative activities. Tenure-line faculty will continue to receive six WTUs per year for service activities (IRRs). The remaining 21 WTUs will be assigned by the Dean or designee, for a total of 30 WTUs per academic year for eligible tenure-line faculty on semesters. To be eligible for the TSM allocation, a faculty member must still be teaching at least six WTUs per year after the TSM assigned time is awarded.

Q: Are new tenure-track hires eligible for the TSM assigned time? Can they receive the 3 WTUs for TSM in addition to the assigned time granted to them for their first two years?

A: New tenure-track hires are not eligible during the first two years of employment as they are already receiving assigned time. They will be eligible for the 3 WTUs for the Teacher Scholar Model beginning in their third year.

Q: Are Cal Poly Solano faculty eligible for the TSM assigned time?

A: Yes.

Q: Are FERP faculty eligible for the TSM assigned time?

A: No, FERP faculty are not eligible for the TSM assigned time. Only full-time tenure-line faculty will be eligible for the TSM assigned time.

Q: Are faculty on a Permanent Reduction in Time Base (PRTB) eligible for TSM assigned time?

A: No, PRTB faculty are not eligible for the TSM assigned time. Only full-time tenure-line faculty will be eligible for the TSM assigned time.

Q: Are faculty members who are awarded a sabbatical or difference in pay leave eligible for the TSM assigned time?

A: No, faculty who are granted a sabbatical or difference in pay leave are not eligible during the academic year when that leave is taken.

Q: I'm a lecturer at Cal Poly. Will I be provided with the 3 WTUs of assigned time for the teacher-scholar model? If not, are there other opportunities for lecturer assigned time?

A: While lecturers are not eligible for the 3 WTUs for the Teacher Scholar Model, there are other opportunities to obtain assigned time, such as the Research, Scholarly, and Creative Activities (RSCA) Grant Program and the Teacher-Scholar Mini-Grant (TSMG), for which lecturers are eligible to apply.

Q: I have a grant that provides paid release time. Will I receive the 3 WTUs for the Teacher Scholar Model from the University on top of the grant-funded release I already have?

A: Yes, within the limitations mentioned above. To be eligible for the TSM units, a faculty member will need to still be teaching at least six (6) WTUs for the year, after the assigned time units are awarded.

Q: I have assigned time for other duties. Am I still eligible to receive 3 WTUs for the teacher-scholar model from the University on top of the release I already have?

A: Yes, within the limitations mentioned above. To be eligible for the TSM units, a faculty member will need to still be teaching at least six (6) WTUs for the year, after the assigned time units are awarded.

Q: Will librarians be eligible for assigned time for the TSM?

A: The Dean of the Library will make determinations based on individual work assignments.

Q: Is this program permanent, or will it be renewed yearly, or biannually? Is this program dependent on the health of the campus budget?

A: This is intended to be a long-term program. Any program may be affected by changes to the campus budget and priorities. This program will be reviewed annually based on its impact and financial sustainability.

Q: I really like to teach and don't want the 3 WTUs of TSM assigned time. Can I opt out?

A: An individual faculty member can opt out and not receive the 3 WTUs for the Teacher Scholar Model.

Q: Can I give my TSM assigned time to a junior faculty member who could really use it?

A: An individual faculty member cannot transfer the TSM assigned time to another faculty member.

Q: Can the 3 WTUs for the TSM be banked and used in a subsequent academic year?

A: No, the assigned time needs to be used during the academic year when it is made available. It cannot be banked for a subsequent academic year.

Q: Can I be paid for the TSM assigned time as extra compensation?

A: No, this is not allowed or consistent with the objectives of the Teacher Scholar Model.

Q: Will Retention, Promotion, and Tenure (RPT) be affected by the 3 WTUs for the Teacher Scholar Model?

A: RPT criteria for programs, departments, or colleges, may be updated to reflect Cal Poly's commitment to the Teacher Scholar Model. RPT criteria are established and updated through a shared governance process.

Q: Will Post Tenure Peer Review (PTPR) be affected by the 3 WTUs for the Teacher Scholar Model?

A: Yes, PTPR will be used to determine whether the faculty member will continue to receive the TSM units.

Q: Do all 3 WTUs have to be taken in one semester?

A: Faculty may request to split the WTUs between semesters in the same academic year with the final determination being made based on program needs by the Dean or designee.

Q: Will the 3 WTUs be included in the term workload, or will they be treated like indirect instruction WTUs and therefore not included?

A: We are working out the details, but it will need to be reported in the same way other assigned time is reported.
