Impact on Existing Policy: Formalizes change in deadline for ordering course materials.

These requirements are, as noted in the HEOA, 'To ensure that students have access to affordable course materials by decreasing costs to students and enhancing transparency and disclosure with respect to the selection, purchase, sale, and use of course materials.'"; and
