The ASCC met every other week, from 3-5pm during the quarter.

January 8, 2019. Comments on the Minors Resolution were discussed, and minor changes made. Additionally, we discussed going to a one-year catalog review cycle. The ASCC agreed it was worth pursuing – the majority (and possibly all) other CSU campuses are on a one-year cycle. This might spread out the amount of program changes we receive, and allow departments to be a bit more agile. There were comments that we would need to determine how to treat Special Topics courses, and if we want to bring back X courses.

January 24, 2019. The committee approved name changes for two certificates: (a) Technical Communication: Change to Technical and Professional Communication (b) Teaching English as a Second Language: Change to Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages We also reviewed an ASCI 270 proposal that was similar to a past offering. This was approved, but will count as the second offering (future offerings will need to go through a full review). We also began preliminary discussions about doing a revised Blended Program resolution.

February 7, 2019. We had a discussion on compressed time schedule courses and how they may affect WASC accreditation. There is concern that some programs may not include any rest time for students. As we receive future proposals for compressed programs, we may need to consider changing the resolution that we passed last year. Additionally, the ASCC reviewed ITP 371, Supply Chain Management in Manufacturing and Services, WGS 201, Introduction to Women's and Gender Studies in the United States, and GSB 570 Marketing Analytics Management.

February 21, 2019. The ASCC reviewed ESM 105 Early Start Program: Mathematics and PHIL 230 Philosophical Classics: Knowledge and Reality. We also discussed programs being offered though Extended Education. The committee understood the different goals and constraints faced by Extended Ed, but wanted to make sure there was always initial consultation with departments where there might be overlap, and that marketing needs to clearly differentiate between Cal Poly degree programs and faculty led opportunities and the Extended Ed versions of educational opportunities.

March 14, 2019. The ASCC reviewed ITP 270 and PSY 340. In addition, we had discussions on the possible one year catalog cycle and a new blended resolution.
