Review and revise existing curricular policy in the context of Q2S conversion. Ongoing through conversion	Ongoing	ASCC is working on a resolution on AP and IB credit to bring Cal Poly's policy in line with the CSU.
Review and revise policy on suspension and discontinuation of academic programs. AY 2025-2026	Ongoing	ASCC Chair met with Andrew Morris (APP) to discuss a resolution. We are waiting for feedback from the administration before proceeding.

Begin review of Cal Poly, Solano campus curriculum for integration into a unified Curriculum Catalog for AY 2028. Ongoing	Ongoing	Solano campus courses have not yet been submitted for review as of the end of Fall Quarter.
Develop coherent policy on minors with regard but not limited to size of minors and overlap between majors/minors and minors/minors. Submit resolution for Senate consideration. AY 2025-2026	Ongoing	ASCC discussed various aspects of minor policies. Overlap is a challenging issue, and we will continue to discuss options.
Discuss and revise curriculum policy related to zero-unit courses, special topic course naming standards, and experiential course unit limits, if applicable. AY 2025-2026	Ongoing	ASCC discussed these policies. We expect to have a resolution on zero-unit and special topic course names soon. Experiential course policies are more challenging because those would require a specific definition of an “experiential” course. Also, the nature of some programs requires a larger number of “experiential” units. We will continue to discuss.
Review and modify committee procedures and bylaws to include representation from the Cal Poly, Solano campus and reflect the university’s conversion to semesters (as needed). AY 2025-2026	Ongoing	No action was needed on this during Fall Quarter.
Revise ASCC policies, procedures, and role for curriculum review. Ongoing	Ongoing	ASCC discussed how to proceed with these policies.
Discuss and review the impact of Year-Round Operations (YRO) calendar and administrative structure on ASCC bylaws, policies, Solano academic calendar considerations, and procedures, and draft revisions as needed for possible YRO start in 2028. Ongoing through conversion	Ongoing	ASCC took no action yet on this issue since many aspects of YRO implementation, and how it would affect curriculum, are unknown.
