# RESOLUTION ON COURSES WITH CONDENSED TIME SCHEDULES FOR QUARTER-TO-SEMESTER CONVERSION

**Impact on Existing Policy:** Supersedes and updates AS-838-17; refers to but does not supersede or modify AS-922-21 i

1 2 3	WHEREAS,	The Chancellor's Office has mandated that Cal Poly convert to semesters by fall of 2026; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS,	Conversion to semesters requires that all academic policies be reviewed and revised as appropriate; and
7 8 9 10	WHEREAS,	Courses are being re-packaged in interesting ways during time periods outside of the traditional quarter or semester term, such as, but not limited to, international studies classes, summer experiences, the fourweek summer institute, and quarter plus; and
12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS,	Coded Memorandum AA-2011-14 from the Chancellor's Office defines a credit hour as "the amount of work represented in intended learning outcomes and verified by evidence of student achievement that is an institutionally established equivalency that reasonably approximates not less than: one hour of classroom or direct faculty instruction and a minimum of two hours of out-of-class student work each week for approximately fifteen weeks for one semester or trimester hour of credit or ten to twelve weeks for one quarter hour of credit, or the equivalent amount of work over a different amount of time"; and
22 23 24 25	WHEREAS,	AS-922-21 further describes Cal Poly's credit hour policy and procedures for reviewing and ensuring compliance with the credit hour definition; and
26 27 28	WHEREAS:	The WSCUC definition of a credit hour reads in part that a credit-hour "approximates not less than: a. One hour of classroom or direct faculty instruction and a minimum of two hours of out-of-class student work

29		each week", while CSU and Cal Poly policy understands a credit hour to
30		be a 50-minute (not 60-minute) period, and

32	WHEREAS,	AS-838-17 requires that any quarter-system course or group of courses
33		that in its new condensed format averages less than three days per unit
34		must be approved by the appropriate College Curriculum Committee(s)
35		and the Academic Senate Curriculum Committee at least 60 days before
36		they are offered in a compressed time scale; and

38	WHEREAS,	AS-838-17 provides as a reason for this policy that it may prove difficult
39		to attain the approved Course Learning Objectives if students are
40		expected to work more than 10 hours in any given day; and

42	WHEREAS,	A one-unit course during a 15-week semester translates to 45 total credit
43		hours (37.5 actual hours) of student work; therefore be it
44		
45	RESOLVED:	any semester-system course or group of courses that in its new
46		condensed format averages less than 4 days (including weekends) per
47		unit must be approved by the appropriate College Curriculum
48		Committee(s) and the Academic Senate Curriculum Committee at least
49		60 days before they are offered in a compressed time scale.
