## RESOLUTION ON IN-RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT FOR LAST 30 UNITS FOR QUARTER-TO-SEMESTER CONVERSION

Impact on Existing Policy: Supersedes and updates AS-827-17

1 2 3	WHEREAS,	The Chancellor's Office has mandated that Cal Poly convert to semesters by fall of 2026; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS,	Conversion to semesters requires that all academic policies be reviewed and revised as appropriate; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS,	AS-827-17 requires that 28 of a student's last 40 quarter-units be completed in residence; and
10 11 12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS,	AS-827-17 states that "Although the origins of this requirement, which appears in catalogs dating back to the 1950s, are unknown, it can be inferred that Cal Poly faculty, like those of some other peer institutions, have defined the integrity of a degree as requiring that an appropriate number of senior-level courses be completed at the degree-granting institution"; and
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS,	Currently active blanket substitutions modify the '28 out of 40' requirement for students who study away on a Cal Poly led program, Cal Poly affiliated program, or department-approved exchange program:  BCSM and CENG waive the requirement entirely; OCOB and CAFES allow 20 of the last 40 units to be taken away; CLA allows 25 of the last 40 units to be taken away; and
25 26 27 28	WHEREAS,	A typical undergraduate degree in the semester system will comprise 120 semester-units versus the 180 quarter-units currently required; therefore be it

29 30	RESOLVED:	That 18 of the last 30 semester-units required for the degree must be taken in residence; and be it further

33		waive this requirement for students who study away on a Cal Poly led

35		exchange program for part of their last 30 units; and be it further

38		under the 2026-27 and subsequent semester-based Catalogs.

Subject: Response to AS-964-23 Resolution on In-Residence Requirement for Last 30 Units for Quarter-To-Semester Conversion

By way of this memo, I am pleased to approve the above-entitled Academic Senate resolution which directly updates existing requirements on in-residence requirements for the purpose of the conversion to semesters.

This resolution will facilitate the transfer of the allowable number of units within the last 30 units that our students take in residence at Cal Poly. The commitment to the Learn by Doing curriculum will be upheld by providing for the final capstone degree requirements to be completed at Cal Poly, while also providing colleges the flexibility to waive this requirement for students involved in high-impact practices, who study abroad/away, and department exchange programs.
