**Subject:** Response to AS-965-23 Resolution on UFPP 11.6 Academic Unit Reorganization

By way of this memo, I acknowledge the above-entitled Academic Senate resolution and thank the Academic Senate and Faculty Affairs Committee for their attention to this matter.

I fully appreciate the faculty's revisions to the established Reorganization of Academic Programs and Academic Units and Suspension of Programs, but I cannot approve or accept the above resolution and proposed addition to the University Faculty Personnel Policies (UFPP). The responsibility for making changes or reorganizations within academic units resides within the authority of the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs.

The UFPP policy outlined within the above-entitled resolution illustrates the necessity for a more robust and inclusive consultation to occur. I expect that in consultation with the Office of the Provost, the Academic Senate and the Office of Academic Programs and Planning will work jointly to formulate updated processes and guidelines for reorganizations of academic units and suspension of academic programs. These processes should be developed within specified areas of authority for such matters and will be presented for consideration.
