- Cal Poly Sustainability "Earth Week" will be April 18 22 concluding with a charrette scheduled for Earth Day 2022, Friday April 22nd with the topic "How to Accelerate Cal Poy's Carbon Neutrality."
- Green Campus is working on conservation and diversion (re. waste stream?)
- E, U, & S has two full-time fellows: One working on campus energy dashboard under Chad Worth and one, Kori Neilson, working on Kylee's sustainability learning community.

- **3. Discussion of the SUSCAT rubric:** (a refresher) re. the different ways JReich and Jay Peters applied it to "SOC 431: World Population Problems & Processes." The point of this exercise is simply to compare understanding on application of the rubric.

Jay suggests more inclusive big tent approach in interpreting the rubric. Braun suggests verify authenticity and to avoid greenwashing. JR suggests courses for SUSCAT should as minimum reference the SLOs in the syllabus and have a line or two reflecting how they achieve the SLOs, which means students have.

Braun reminded us that the SLOs assessments involve assessing student knowledge and attitudes, not course syllabuses.

Resolved: Kylee will modify the OneDrive SUSCAT invitation to add fill-in space for faculty to briefly write how their course relates to the SLOs, which will make it easier for ASSC to evaluate courses for SUSCAT.

JR reminded ASSC of our basic charges to:

And perhaps "send them our SUSCAT Evaluation Rubric for their course and see if they have a comment or update.

A mass email like this may be unlikely to see a lot of responses from faculty, but at least it might keep them aware that there are other sustainability efforts going on around campus and could encourage them to re-evaluate their course in a sustainability context."



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

- 2. Dennis Elliot had requested 10-15 minutes: and he explained that Armstrong rhad eached out to him re. AASHE STARS status which focused his thinking about this year's Friday April 22 Sustainability Charrette topic, and so he'd like the annual Joint SAC/ASSC Meeting to plan how the charrette can focus on improving AASHE STARS rating.

Ensuing discussion about improving AASHE STARS included: increasing number of SUSCAT courses, doing more sustainability research, accelerating Cal Poy's achievement of Carbon Neutrality, and how the jobs/housing balance issue is crucial GHGs issue and thus carbon neutrality. Another issue that was discussed was how sustainability and climate related work are not currently seen as advancement opportunities and how the charrette might help the provost to not to be afraid of sustainability...

Suggestion was made that the quarter to semesters conversion, when all courses will be adjusted, will be an opportunity to increase sustainability JReich mentioned his current Swanton Pacific Ranch(SPR) "Field Studies Camp" project and how SPR is a brilliant sustainability / biodiversity / carbon neutrality related advancement opportunity...

Dianna spoke to the Michael Nguyen comment (related to the issue of how Cal Poly has the SLOs, but the SLOs are not assessed!) – Nguyen is meeting with CAFES dean to work on SLOs assessment at CAFES level (!)

And - she met with Bruno Giberti about how SLOs are not assessed.

Bruno suggested pitching assessment council how SLOs integrate with core competency plan.

Braun: It would greatly help, if the SLOs would appear explicitly in the core competency plan and resulting assessment.

10:25am: Discussion with Erin Pearse about his email of February 24th (below) suggesting there be a "Sustainability Overlay" (similar to USCP) or a Sustainability pathway in GE. Erin explained the idea and recommended to go directly to students and ask them if they want a sustainability requirement. JReich invited Andrew Kim and Chris Raynes to share how they became interested in sustainability and they explained it didn't happen at Cal Poly. Dianna explained difficulties of adding a sustainability overlay saying it's Catch-22, adding a subject overlay requires courses be available - but getting courses available depends on them being required. Long discussion of GE sust. pathway and past Academic Senate support expressed effusively by Dustin Stegner for our suggested GE Sustainability Pathway.

Great timing, indeed.

In addition to ASSC's attention on this subject matter, a group of faculty members have carried out a continuous study to assess Cal Poly's sustainability learning outcomes, and we are at the beginning of the third round of study aiming to formally assess the educational implications of SusCat (Cal Poly's sustainability catalog). In the past, we had faculty members from various departments, and some of them have left Cal Poly or retired, but we managed to have new faculty join this work force as well. Kylee and I are among the "oldest" members in this group, with Jay as our new Jedi.

In each round of study, we published a peer-reviewed journal article with little financial support from the University. I would like to brainstorm how this kind of campus-wide collaborative effort can be strategically sustained. If you're interested, I can share our research results with you and discuss where we can go from here.

Subject: Academic Senate proposal: Sustainability overlay

Dear Sustainability Committee of the Academic Senate,

I would like to propose that the committee work towards incorporation of student exposure to sustainability in a couple of ways. It will be critically important for a modern workforce to understand the basic concepts of sustainability and climate change, and to understand that acting on these principles is necessary for folks in all walks of life, and that there are necessary and important actions to be taken in any career trajectory.

Two possible avenues:

- An overlay (like USCP)
- A GE Pathway

Some students are already drawn towards sustainability topics, but this results in "preaching to the choir". As a mechanism to enlarge the tent, I suggest an overlay model, following the US Cultural Pluralism requirement. It is broadly defined: there are many courses that fill this requirement. However, it is a mandatory requirement for all students.

I've dug up the relevant resolutions from USCP and collected them

I can put some time into cobbling together a first draft of what such a requirement might look like, and what the corresponding resolution would look like. However, I wanted to check with you all to see what your thoughts are:

- Is this a good idea?
- Has it been attempted before? (Or is someone else working currently on something similar?)
- Would anyone else like to get directly involved?

I haven't done anything like this before, so my attempt is going to be something of a hatchet job ...

Along similar but different lines, there is also the possibility of making a GE Pathway in Sustainability. I talked some with Gary Laver about this, and he said there are many issues to consider, following the discussion last winter/spring of a pilot pathway through GE, but this is potentially feasible. A pathway differs from an overlay in that (i) it is optional for students, so may not introduce previously uninterested students to the implications of the climate crisis, (ii) a pathway would consist of multiple courses, and (iii) a pathway would be pretty rigid: there might just be one set of courses that anyone taking the pathway must complete.

The overlay and the GE pathway can both be done through Cal Poly, locally, but it is also possible these lead to something being adopted more widely. With our existing networks, and the current CSU-wide Faculty Learning Community on Climate Change, we may be able to develop materials that can be shared across campuses, and build support for pressing the entire CSU to adopt large-scale integration of sustainability into the curriculum.
