AY 2020-21	<input type="checkbox"/>	We have covered observation of instruction with a special emphasis on observing online instruction (UFPP 8.2) with AS-920-21. We had proposed policies providing guidance in the evaluation of online instruction, but have withheld those policies from final Senate consideration. Those policies made use of curricular definitions of online instruction. However, AS-903-20 suspended curricular review for online instructional modalities through AY 2021-22. FAC should receive this charge again in AY 2021-22.
