Work with Sustainability Committee to develop sustainable pathways in General Education.	I met with Dustin Stegner and Jonathan Reich in January to discuss this issue. GE courses that focus on sustainability are already being flagged.
Review of curriculum proposals: catalog cycle proposals and continuous course review proposal. Ongoing.	We reviewed multiple proposals in winter quarter. I also met with multiple faculty from Architecture to discuss proposals they are developing. The GEGB struggled to review e-learning addendums and will be requesting clearer guidelines and criteria for reviewing online proposals in the future.
Explore "course renewal" cycle (in tandem with ASCC). Ongoing .	This has been tabled as we address EO 1100.
Work with appropriate groups to develop criteria for GWR expansion and submit a resolution for approval. Winter 2018	I worked with Dawn Janke, Greg Bohr, and Dianne Winslow to develop a resolution. The GEGB discussed it briefly in winter, but will discuss it further in spring.

NOTES:

• The GEGB continues to respond to the revised EO 1100. In winter, the committee voted to move current Area F classes into a new Area B7. A resolution has been drafted to present to the Academic Senate in spring.

- I also presented a draft resolution on "Integrity in General Education Transfer Substitutions" to the Academic Senate Executive Committee in February. The committee decided not to forward the resolution to the senate floor, but offered helpful feedback for improving it.
- I have continued to collaborate with International Programs to assign GE credit to courses students take while studying abroad.
