Preparations, including juror recruitment, for the CSU-wide Student Research Competition are ongoing and on schedule. Juror recruitment is a challenge, as it relies on recruitment of 90 knowledgeable community members who are not Cal Poly faculty and willing to spend a day judging student presentations. The committee is happy to report that juror recruitment is nearly complete.

Research, Scholarly, and Creative Activities Grant Proposal:

RSCA proposals were submitted by February 16, 2017. The committee received 63 proposals from across campus. Proposals are currently under review by the committee. Each proposal will be reviewed by three committee members and evaluated according to the GRC's rubric. Each committee member is responsible for reviewing 31-32 proposals. Proposal reviews are due on April 17. Committee members will meet shortly thereafter to evaluate the initial rankings, discuss proposals, and finalize funding decisions.
