The first meeting of the quarter centered around Dawn Neil outlining the recently-launched Teacher/Scholar Mini-Grant Program. Dawn stated that feedback and discussion from this year's RSCA committee meetings was valuable in informing aspects of the new TS Mini-Grant Program.

At the second meeting, in addition to discussing the travel ban, Jesse and the members in attendance compiled a set of potential directions for next year.
