But our committee also feels this Committee members also had concerns about sending out a survey about the CA travel ban, as some might consider it a political issue. The committee also felt that the letter in WPAF would support faculty in the RPT process who had to cancel or change travel or RSCA due to COVID and CA travel bans. With that 'blanket' letter in all WPAF, and the difficulty in assessing these two charges, the committee thought that a more useful question might be to ask "what, moving forward, might be challenges to faculty RSCA due to covid restrictions or the CA travel ban?" and "what have been your work arounds" The committee, though, felt that its ability to accurately assess this would be difficult. Our ability to systematically gather data is almost none, since the committee cannot send out an all-faculty survey. The committee would have to rely on Senators or department heads/chairs to help gather data, which could end up as anecdotes and/or not representative of all faculty. The committee understands the importance of supporting faculty in these areas, and going forward would like to discuss what the outcome of such data gathering efforts might be (i.e. resolution?
