New ASI Student committee member and 2 faculty-at-large members were added to the committee this term to fill vacancies. Only Sofia Buduchi and Jennifer Teramoto Pedrotti were not present but committee was updated after the meeting via email. The committee met Monday, December 11, to review charge and workload and schedule for quarter to semester conversion courses that are proposed as USCP courses. Standing meetings are scheduled for Winter 2024, weekly on Thursdays at 10am starting on January 25. We'll begin with courses that had been previously recertified and are only undergoing conversion as well as ES and WGQS courses (31 courses). During Winter, we'll review GE USCP courses (36 additional courses). During Spring, we'll review the remaining non-GE USCP courses (24 courses).
