Mitchelson landed on the Central Coast in 2018, taking an initial position as general manager of a winery/vineyard in Sta. Rita Hills and is now managing four historic brands as senior south coast estate manager

for Jackson Family Wines, the ninth largest wine producer in the U.S. She has charted her own unique path through the world of multi-million case producers as well as boutique micro-vintners and it is her mission to shift representation in a predominantly and historically white industry. In 2020, Mitchelson, alongside Cal Poly alumnus Justin Trabue, created the Scholarship for BIPOC Students in Wine and Viticulture at Cal Poly which saw its first recipients in fall 2021. She also works on the community relations subcommittee for Jackson Family Wines' larger DEI initiatives and is a co-founder of the nonprofit Natural Action, a wine club whose mission is to provide opportunities to BIPOC through education, winemaking programs, mentorship, and careers. She was recently chosen as Wine Enthusiast's 40 Under 40 Tastemakers, Wine Business' Top Industry Leaders, and Imbibe's Top 75 People to Watch.
