INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences (CAFES) **Earn by Doing Internship Program** is an opportunity for students to gain paid work experience at one or more of the college's on-campus food and agricultural production units or departments. The program allows students to work part-time, up to 20 hours per week, gaining technical skills in positions directly related to their chosen careers. Students have historically been paid, but only when budgets permit, and many units are currently understaffed.

STUDENT IMPACT
