Updated Case Information Posted on Campus Coronavirus Site

As additional COVID-19 cases occur within the campus community, the university will continue to provide the latest information at coronavirus.calpoly.edu. The site is updated daily with the number of COVID-19 cases in the campus community, in San Luis Obispo County, the state and the U.S. In addition, campus community members are urged to continue to follow all COVID-19 prevention and safety measures, including frequent hand-washing, following stay-at-home orders, and physical distancing. The state has also mandated that face coverings be worn when people are outside their homes in specific circumstances. At Cal Poly, face coverings are required in indoor public spaces, including classrooms, common areas of residence halls, and public areas of campus academic and administrative buildings. They are also required when outdoors in public spaces when a person cannot maintain a physical distance of 6 feet from others. Campus Dining to Use UV Sanitizing Technology This Year

Campus Dining is installing new UV sanitizing technology at all self-serve drink stations for the 2020-21 academic year. ValidFill UV Container Sanitizing units use ultraviolet light to inactivate 99.99% of viruses and bacteria harmful to humans in 20 seconds or less. Designed to fit on a countertop, the units will be available on the first and second floor of the new Vista Grande dining complex and in Campus Market, next to the self-service beverage fountains. The use of the ValidFill units is just one of many steps that Campus Dining is taking to help ensure the health and safety of the Cal Poly community. 2020 Learn by Doing Scholar Award Winners Announced

The awardees of the Learn by Doing Scholar Awards, which recognize and encourage faculty scholarship on the pedagogy of Learn by Doing across all disciplines, have been announced.

— Learn by Doing Scholar Career Award: Architecture Department Associate Department Head Professor Robert Arens, Associate Professor Carmen Trudell, and Assistant Professor Brian Osborn for their project titled "Teaching Architectural Technology: A Scholarly Approach." An exemplar of their research was an article, "Testing is Teaching Too: Transitioning a Large-Lecture Course from Summative to Formative Exams," which was published in June 2019 conference proceedings of the Building Technology Educator's Society. This work has already been viewed 79 times and downloaded 40 times.

— Learn by Doing Scholar Early Career Award: Assistant Professors Javin Oza and Katharine Watts of the Chemistry and Biochemistry Department for their project titled "Genetic Code in a Test Tube: Unlocking the Cell for Learn by Doing." Their work has resulted in numerous publications and presentations and has been supported by a National Science Foundation Research in Undergraduate Institutions (NSF-RUI) grant.

The Career Award is accompanied by a cash prize of \$2,000, and the Early Career Award has a cash prize of \$1,000. The Learn by Doing Scholar Awards were established in 2014 and are financially supported by the Library Dean's Advisory Council in recognition of the quality, significance and impact of Learn by Doing scholarship. Reservations Available for Student-Run Succulentopia Plant Sale at Cal Poly

More than 100 varieties of student-grown succulents are available for purchase at Poly Plant Shop at Cal Poly. The succulent plant sale, typically held during spring quarter in the college's Horticulture Unit, was moved to a reservation-based system to meet state physical distancing guidelines for COVID-19. Poly Plant Shop is now open Thursday through Saturday. While walk-in customers will be accommodated as space allows, customers may make a reservation for up to two people for one hour at the plant shop to guarantee their entrance. To make a reservation, visit polyplantshop.com. Appointments are available from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., with a limit of six reservations per hour. More than 4,000 plants are available for purchase. Cost is determined by size, with prices ranging from \$3 to \$30 and sizes ranging from 4-inch pots to 8-inch succulent gardens.

ITS Introduces Online Support Center

At the end of July, Information Technology Services (ITS) will launch the new, virtual Support Center, powered by Atlassian. Support Center is an online portal where Cal Poly students, faculty and staff can request tech support or one of the many other services that ITS offers. Whether someone emails the ITS Service Desk directly, or clicks "Submit a Ticket" from the ITS Service Catalog (<https://tech.calpoly.edu/services>), their request will be managed through the Support Center to provide a more user-friendly interface and streamlined notifications. Support Center connects to the ITS Knowledge Base (also powered by Atlassian) to provide the most relevant self-help articles when a user is selecting their topic of request. The launch of Support Center is the beginning of a phased approach to improving ITS service delivery to campus. Therefore, requests for some services (including Cal Poly accounts and software downloads) will still temporarily be managed through the Service Request System (SRS), accessed through the Technical Service Request link under My Apps in the My Cal Poly Portal.
