Thanks to all campus community members who took the time to share firsthand accounts of their experiences at Cal Poly during CPX Listening Sessions last week. The sessions are an essential part of the CPX (Cal Poly Experience) Study, which also includes a campuswide survey starting April 9. Those who were unable to attend a listening session are encouraged to put any comments they might have shared there into the survey. The information gathered through the CPX Listening Sessions and CPX Survey will be used to assess current perspectives, attitudes and experiences related to diversity, equity and inclusion at Cal Poly. A personalized email will be sent April 9 to all students, faculty and staff to complete the short, confidential survey from diversity and inclusion expert Damon A. Williams and his research team at the Center for Strategic Diversity Leadership and Social Innovation. The aggregate data from the CPX Study will be released in fall 2019. The results will support the development and refinement of the university's programs and services to create a more equitable, inclusive campus community. Campuswide Power Outage Planned for March 30

PG&E plans to shut off power to the campus while performing maintenance and repairs to equipment on Saturday, March 30. All electrical power to the campus will be temporarily unavailable. This outage is scheduled for 12 hours, from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. During the outage, only student residents and essential personnel required for critical operations should be present on campus. It is recommended that all other personnel reschedule any planned work for after the outage has ended. All systems that do not have alternative emergency generator power will be impacted by the outage. Departments that typically utilize equipment requiring electrical service on Saturdays are advised to plan for the outage. All electrical equipment, including computer work stations, should be powered down at the close of business Friday, March, 29. In Memoriam

Zane Motteler, who joined the Computer Science Department in the fall of 1982 as a faculty member, died Jan. 3, 2019. Motteler worked for the department for over 10 years and was instrumental in the initial development of the computer engineering program, which launched in 1989. He was involved in the Computer Science Accreditation Commission and played a significant role in the accreditation of the computer science program. After leaving Cal Poly, he worked at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory before retiring from the laboratory and from Computing Accreditation Commission activities. After retirement, Motteler moved with his wife, Marilyn, to Albuquerque, New Mexico, where he kept busy with his long-term hobby of genealogy and volunteered in a number of activities. Members of the Retired Faculty and Staff club praise Motteler's professional demeanor and moral character.
