In Memoriam

Cal Poly Professor Emeritus **Jean Marie McDill, Ph.D.**, died Dec. 8, 2017. McDill taught in the Mathematics Department from 1973 until 2006. She was one of the first women to teach in the department and she was a wonderful mentor to female faculty who were hired after her. A memorial concert will be held on Saturday, March 24, at Castoro Cellars (1315 N. Bethel Road, Templeton, CA 93465). At 6:30 p.m. family and friends will share remembrances, followed by a memorial concert at 7:30 p.m. The family would like to thank SLOFolks, of which McDill was a founding member, for organizing this concert.

A celebration of life will be held for former physics Professor **James Kalathil** from 2 to 5 p.m. Saturday, March 24, at the Monday Club at 1815 Monterey St. in San Luis Obispo.

Augie Garrido, who coached baseball for three seasons at Cal Poly before guiding Cal State Fullerton and Texas to a total of five national championships and compiling a record 1,975 career victories, died Thursday in Newport Beach, Calif. Garrido, 79, died of complications following a stroke. Garrido coached at Cal Poly from 1970-72 and his 84-63-1 record with the Mustangs included a 39-11-1 campaign in 1971 with Mike Krukow as one of his pitchers. Garrido coached a pair of no-hitters — Dean Treanor in a 2-0 win over Cal Poly Pomona in 1970 and Les Ohrn in a 1-0 triumph, also against Cal Poly Pomona, in 1971.
