## **PeopleSoft Upgrade: Financial Administration (CFS) Unavailable Nov. 13-15**

The PeopleSoft Financial Administration (CFS) application, accessed through the My Cal Poly Portal, will be unavailable from 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 13, through 8 a.m. Monday, Nov. 16, due to a required upgrade. During the maintenance window, the link accessed through My Apps (CSU Portal — Financial Administration) will be unavailable. This upgrade is required to ensure that Cal Poly stays up to date with security patches and bug fixes. ## **Issue with macOS Big Sur Release**

Apple is releasing macOS Big Sur today, and unfortunately, the current versions of Global Protect virtual private network (VPN) and Sophos antivirus software do not function properly on Mac computers running the Big Sur operating system. At this time, Information Technology Services (ITS) recommends that members of the Cal Poly community who use GlobalProtect VPN and/or Sophos on a Mac do not download macOS Big Sur until both GlobalProtect and Sophos come out with an upgrade that resolves the issue. No action is required by faculty and staff who are using a state-managed computer. ITS is working with both GlobalProtect and Sophos on this issue, and when they release new versions, we will make them available and update campus as quickly as possible. Questions? **Marc Godfrey** will retire from the Cal Poly Police Department after 23 years in the field. After serving 10 years as an officer for the Morro Bay Police Department, Godfrey began working at Cal Poly in October 2007 and was promoted to sergeant in October 2017. During this time, he has served as a field training officer and terrorism liaison officer, among many other assignments. During his retirement he plans to relax and enjoy the approaching holidays but inevitably get back into some kind of security work, definitely not anything that involves 12-hour night shifts. Throughout his 23 years of full-time police service Godfrey has fostered a special bond with his coworkers. He notes that police work is a sacrifice, as much of the work goes unnoticed while most officers are working tirelessly every day, rain or shine, over holidays, 24 hours a day answering the call for service. Godfrey will miss working with his fellow officers and will be missed and remembered by the Cal Poly community. We thank him for committing himself to tirelessly going the extra distance to keep the Cal Poly community safe.

After working with the Cal Poly Performing Arts Center (PAC) for over 15 years, **Dave Lowden** will retire and start the next chapter of his life. Lowden started as an accountant at the PAC and worked his way up to the manager of finance role where he served as the budget specialist, handling all things accounting and finance related for the PAC and the Cal Poly Ticket Office. Born and raised in New York state, Lowden went to school in Boston and was working in New Hampshire in 2001. In the wake of Sept. 11 his department was closed. He bought an Indian Motorcycle and traveled the country from coast to coast. On Christmas Eve 2002 he landed on the Central Coast. The following spring he made the move permanent. He is grateful that the Performing Arts Center had a role for him and that Ron Regier, the PAC's first managing director, saw something in him that was a perfect fit. After his time at the PAC, he plans to catch up on some long-awaited travel with his wife, hopefully to Hawaii, Hungary, Sweden and Israel.
