Speakers Report Results of CPX Survey and Share Next Steps

Cal Poly unveiled the results of the Cal Poly Experience (CPX) survey, as the university enters the second phase of an ongoing diversity and inclusion initiative that began earlier this year. The survey results provide a comprehensive picture of the experiences of students, faculty and staff; highlight areas for improvement; and lay out a clear path forward. The results show more negative experiences and greater challenges at Cal Poly among campus community members from traditionally underrepresented and marginalized groups. The report also found an extraordinary and widespread level of awareness about diversity, equity and inclusion and a concern for others even when one's own experience is comfortable. With the results, the university will develop a series of action plans that spell out specific goals and strategies for the campus community. These action plans will build on past and ongoing efforts by many university community members and the Office of University Diversity and Inclusion to thread diversity and inclusion throughout the university. "The campus has been waiting for the survey results to further inform actions and connect the work that has come before," said Jozi De Leon, vice president of diversity and inclusion and chief diversity officer (pictured). "Through this work, I envision that we will create a culture of inclusion on our campus in which every student and every employee can show up every day knowing they are welcome and they belong." Succulentopia to Offer Over 7,000 Plants Oct. 25-26

More than 150 varieties of succulents will be available at Cal Poly's Succulentopia plant sale from noon to 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 25, and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 26, at the Horticulture Unit at the Poly Plant Shop. More than 7,000 plants will be available for purchase. Five students are involved in the student-run project, one of several such hands-on experiences offered by the College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences' Horticulture and Crop Science Department. The cost of the plants will range from \$4.50 to \$7 for 4-inch plants. Larger plants are priced accordingly, mostly below \$12; 6-inch succulent garden, \$12.50; 8-inch succulent garden, \$25.
