Services Overview

MustangJobs

Through MustangJobs, students can apply to jobs, internships and co-ops in locations nationwide, as well as local part-time and on-campus jobs. Additionally, students can learn about and sign up for career fairs, workshops and career counseling appointments.



Career Counseling

Our career counselors help students achieve success and obtain meaningful careers after graduation. Freshman Focus Team counselors assist first-time first-year students with clarifying majors and developing career plans. College specialist career counselors liaise with the six academic colleges and support students from their second year through graduation. All career counselors offer scheduled appointments as well as targeted programming for their designated student populations.

On-Campus Interviews and Information Sessions

Students can interview with employers who visit campus through our on-campus interview program. They can also learn about a company's opportunities, hiring process and culture via company information sessions. Some companies choose to engage in these programs on campus, while others conduct these recruiting strategies virtually.

Career Fairs

Career Services hosts a Fall Career Fair, Winter Career Fair and Spring Career Fair annually, plus numerous specialized and virtual fairs throughout the academic year to provide students with direct access to job and internship opportunities.

Career Education Programs

Workshops, panels, and club and classroom presentations help students explore careers and develop professional skills, such as resume writing, interview techniques, job search strategies, networking, changing majors and salary negotiations. Workshops are interactive and often feature industry and alumni speakers.



Career Curriculum

Career Services offers career curriculum delivered via Canvas modules that faculty can embed in their courses. Each module is designed to be delivered asynchronously and includes several components such as readings, videos and activities, which can be customized to meet instructors' needs.

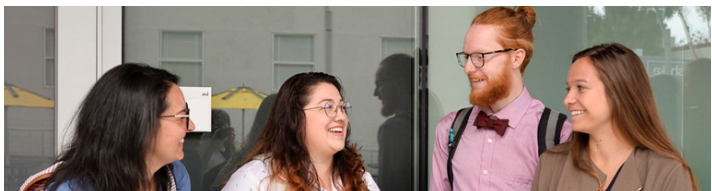
Rooms are available by reservation for students who need a quiet, professional space to participate in a virtual interview.

Career Services provides students with free, high-quality, gently used work clothes to create a memorable first impression at career fairs and interviews.



On-Demand Career Resources

Students can access valuable online career tools anytime, anywhere for virtual mock interviews, AI-driven resume feedback, career assessments and global career exploration using Big Interview, Big Resume (new!), PathwaysU and GoinGlobal, respectively.

Grounded in our Guiding Pillars

The Career Services team continues to align our work with the departmental guiding pillars of Innovation; Personal and Professional Growth; Connections; and Universal Student Success . Our pillars drive how we design and deliver our programs, services, and partnerships, ensuring that our efforts remain intentional, student-centered, and impactful. The following highlights demonstrate how our guiding pillars shaped our initiatives and outcomes in 2024-25:

Provided a record number of 941 unique students with business attire at no cost through our Professional Clothing Closet.

Expanded student and alumni engagement on Cal Poly Career Connections through partnership with Alumni Engagement and support from a CSU grant.

Successfully migrated MustangJobs, our career services management platform, to Symplicity software.

Received the President's Diversity Award for a campus department in recognition of our Community Liaison Teams.

Boosted employer participation in our On-Campus Interview program by 180% over last year.

Provided headshots to over 650 students in student identity centers and at Career Services.

Advanced staff learning and professional growth by participating in trainings, institutes and conferences hosted by regional and national professional associations.

Engaged student groups through our Community Liaison Teams by hosting 10 resume drop-ins at identity centers and facilitating six career-focused workshops tailored to diverse identities.

Hosted our sixth annual Student + Employer Networking Event, attended by over 150 students and employers.

Launched a new First-Generation Professionals workshop for Cal Poly Scholars in winter, then expanded it campuswide in spring.

Created a "Career Services X Disability Resource Center" one-sheet to increase and ease access to our resources.

Facilitated workshops to help international students prepare for the career fair and hosted an alumni panel to foster connections and share insights.

Organized an event for students with dependents and Guardian Scholars that offered resume support, fellowship information, headshots and career workshops

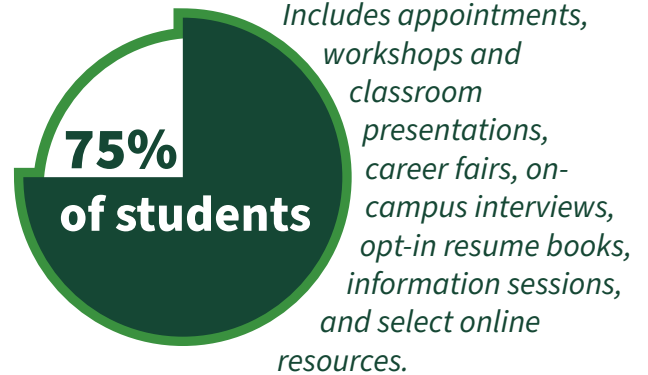

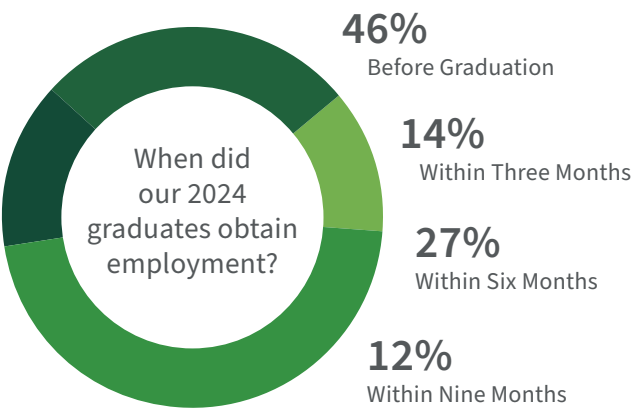
Third-year (Class of '26)

Employment Timeline

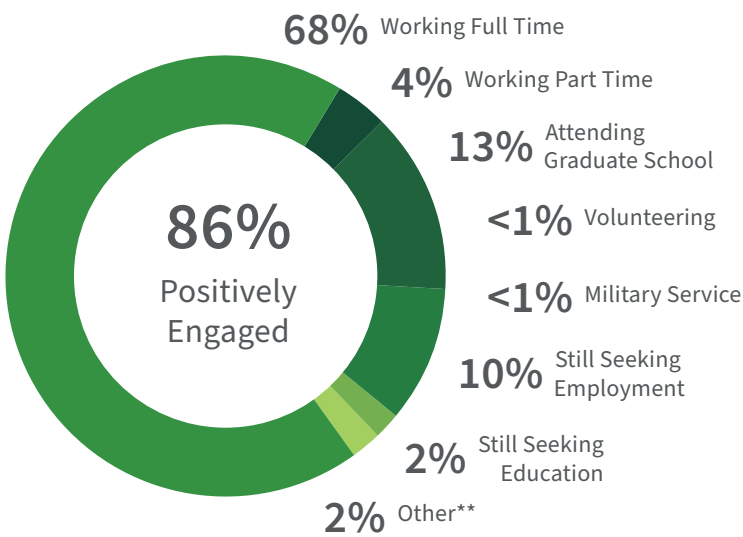

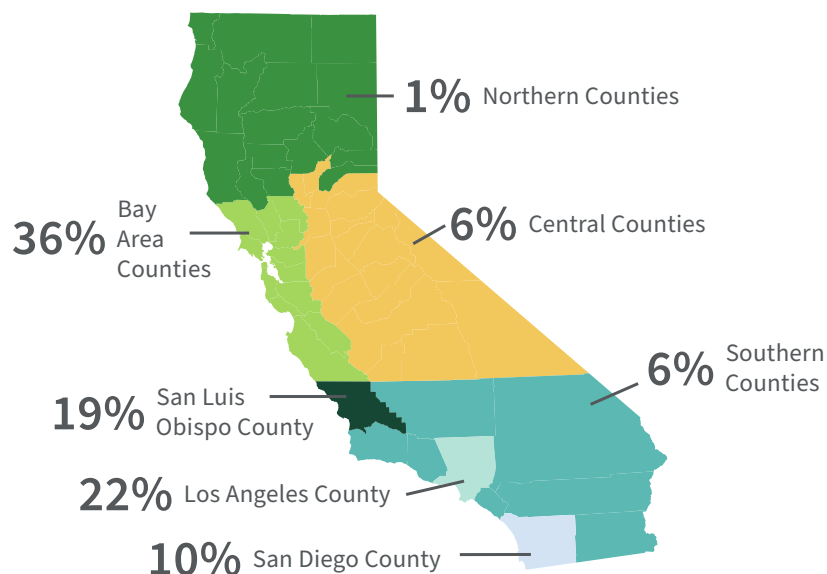

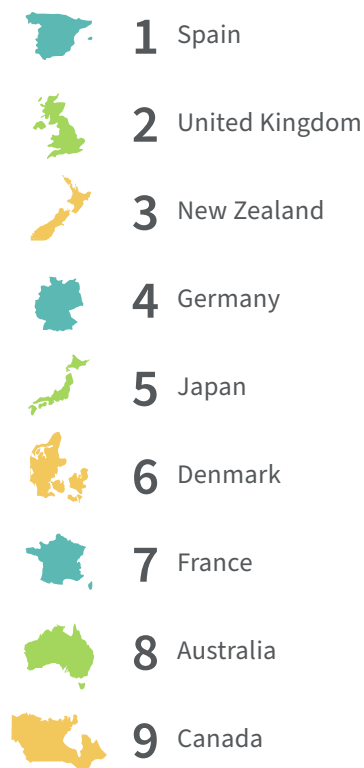

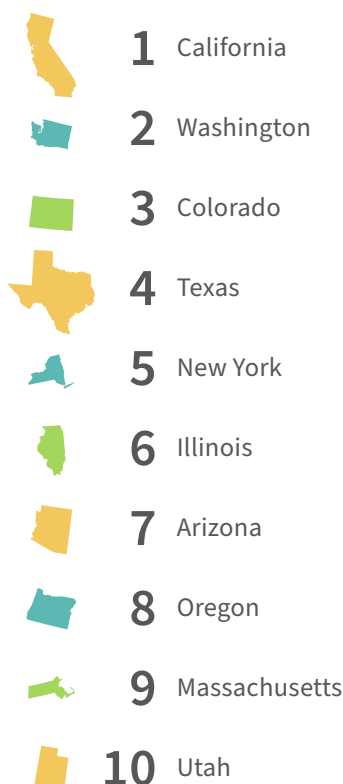
California Employment by Region
