Peter C. Little is a professor of anthropology at Rhode Island College and author of *Toxic Town: IBM, Pollution, and Industrial Risks* (2014), *Burning Matters: Life, Labor, and E-Waste Pyropolitics in Ghana* (2022), and *Critical Zones of Technopower and Global Political Ecology: Platforms, Pathologies, and Plunder* (2023). Peter is also the President of the Northeastern Anthropological Association (NEAA).

Liz Chamberlain is Director of Sustainability at iFixit (and former professor of rhetoric). She advocates for repair-friendly legislation around the world, testifying in statehouses, coordinating repair advocates, and developing reparability standards. Her writing on e-waste and repair has been featured in the *Wall Street Journal* and *Wired*, and she's spoken about repair on NPR, the BBC, and Vox.
