

SUGGESTED COURSES FOR HISTORY (HIST)

- Recommended number of units for fall guarter 2018
 - 12-16 units on the 2017-2019 catalog

II. Major Courses:

- HIST 100-02 or 03
- · HIST 214, 222, or 223, if not yet taken and if available
- HIST 316, 318, 319, 321, 334, 335, 337, 350, and/or 354 (GE Area F) (check prerequisites before enrolling)*

III. Support Courses:

- CHIN, FR, GER, ITAL, JPNS or SPAN 201, if not yet completed and if eligible (students with less preparation in the chosen language should enroll in 101, 102, or 103, and work their way up to 201).
- · Any other upper-division courses to be counted for support.

IV. General Education (GE) Courses:

 Some combination of an Area C4, a non-HIST Area D5, and/or an Area F upper-division GE course, if needed to reach 12-16 units total.

V. Additional Notes:

- *Please note: Some spaces have been reserved in HIST 316, 318, 319, 321, 334, 335, 337, 350, and 354. Please check prerequisites before enrolling.
- The Graduation Writing Requirement (GWR) must be fulfilled by enrolling in a GWR-approved, upper-division English course OR by registering for the Writing Proficiency Examination (WPE). For GWR course information and WPE exam dates and registration, please visit the Writing and Rhetoric Center web page.
- To find out which classes you can use to satisfy the GWR, please check "Show GWR Classes" in the Select Course List menu in PASS.
- Students must satisfy the <u>United States Cultural Pluralism (USCP)</u>
 requirement before graduation. Please check your Degree Progress
 Report to see if you have fulfilled this requirement. If not, you can search
 for classes in PASS that will allow you to satisfy the USCP requirement,
 including classes that satisfy both a GE area and the USCP requirement.

- Depending on prerequisite and availability: ART 224, 213, 311, 317

Music: Dr. Spiller, Department Chair

- Placement exams: Theory, Piano, Musicianship
- 13 units, all MU prefix is recommended
- Ensembles

Theater: Dr. Machamer, Department Chair

- TH 101
- TH 210, if not already completed
- 1-2 of: TH 227, 228, 230/330, 225/325, 270, 341, 345 (check prerequisites)

- Focus on unmet lower division courses first:
 - GRC 101 or 172
 - GRC 201
 - GRC 211 with permission number
- Support courses, if not yet completed
- Declaring your concentration

JOUR: Mary Glick, Department Chair

- Transfer students should take JOUR 102 Fall quarter
- Take JOUR 203, if not yet completed
- Minors are highly recommended



ENGL:

Dr. Rummell, Department Chair

Dr. Forster, Associate Chair

- Must register for ENGL 203 and 303 as assigned by the department
- Consider ENGL 290, if not yet completed
- Foreign language requirement 201 level

HIST:

Dr. Murphy, Department Chair

- HIST 100: Intro to the Study of History must be taken fall quarter
 - Section 02 has seats reserved for transfer student. If this section fills, you may select section 03
- HIST 214, 222 or 223, if not yet taken and available
- Foreign Language Requirement 201 level
- The prerequisite chain that leads to the completion of senior project looks like this: HIST $100 \rightarrow 303 \rightarrow 304 \rightarrow 460 \rightarrow 461$.

COMS: Dr. Duffy, Department Chair

- Foreign language requirement 103 level
- Focus on unmet lower division courses first; as available COMS 213 and 217

ES: Dr. Isom, Department Chair

- Consider unmet lower division courses ES requirements, as well as available upper division requirements (check prerequisites)
- Two quarters of the same foreign language at any level

MLL: Dr. Thompson, Department Chair

- Next level Spanish
- Secondary language or Cal Poly Minor requirement, must be declared
- Language placement exam



Use the Fall Course Recommendations as guidance

Child Development: Dr. Jovanovic, Department Chair

- Must take CD 102 Fall quarter
- Take CD 131, PSY 201/202, 254, 256, if not already completed
- Don't forget to consider support courses
- Prerequisite for BIO 302, if not already completed: ASCI 112, BIO 111, BIO 123, BIO 161, BOT 121



Use the Fall Course Recommendations as guidance

Psychology: Dr. Jovanovic, Department Chair

- Prioritize any unmet lower division course requirements: PSY 201/202, 252, 256
- Don't forget to consider Support courses. Some will double count with a GE
- Other Upper Division PSY Electives
- Prerequisites for BIO 302 and PSY 344, if not already completed: ASCI 112, BIO 111, BIO 123, BIO 161

Political Science: Dr. Lowham, Department Chair

- POLS 180 Fall quarter
- Prioritize unmet lower division major courses: POLS 112, 225, 229, 230
- Other Upper Division POLS

Step 3: Start making a schedule

- Choose a unit load of 12-16 units.
 - Consider outside commitments & the fast pace of the quarter system when determining your unit load.
- If all lower division GEs have been satisfied, select an upper division GE area C4, D5 or F.
 - Tip: Look for GE courses that can double count for the USCP requirement and/or GWR requirement!
- Plan schedules on PASS
 - Be sure to check prerequisites
 - Look for open seats or reserved seats that note "reserved for transfers" or your major.

What's Next?

- 1. Continue planning your schedule
 - "Push" your ideal 16 units from PASS into your Student Center.
 - Have alternative classes ready to add to your schedule.
- 3. Register at 10am, Monday Aug 13th
 - Check waitlisted courses via Student Center after 1pm to confirm enrollment
 - Continue to adjust your schedule within 16 units Aug 13-Aug 16.
 - The goal is to be enrolled in 12-16 units by Thursday, 16th.
- 4. Review your CLA Transfer Student Advising Guide
- 5. Submit your PolyPlan for advisor feedback
- 6. Continue Registration as needed
 - Aug 20th: Second Round Registration, up to 22 units
 - Aug 25-Sept 17: Open Enrollment
- 7. Classes Start Thursday, Sept 20th
