WHAT IS STRATEGIC MINORING?

With more than 90 minor choices, students can strategically pick minors that best complement or emphasize their skill sets. Strategic minoring allows students to combine related skills or areas to complement their future careers (e.g. a political science major minoring in English) or to complement their majors with applicable new skills (e.g. a history student minoring in statistics). The College of Liberal Arts also offers the largest minor in the university, Spanish, as well as minors like women's and gender studies, queer studies and ethnic studies, allowing students to build expertise in DEI-related fields regardless of major.
