Performance, Arts, & Music Club Constitution

Article 1: Name

The official name of the club is "Performance, Arts, & Music Club."

Article 2: Purpose

The purpose of the Performance, Arts, & Music Club is to create a space where students can share their passion for the arts including performance & music. The club provides opportunities for students to practice their instruments, discuss various musical & creative topics, and connect with others who share similar interests. The Performance, Arts, & Music Club also aims to foster a collaborative and creative environment by organizing events and encouraging student performances, promoting musical engagement throughout the campus.

Article 3: Membership

Membership in the Performance, Arts, & Music Club is open to all students of Cal Poly Maritime. There are no prerequisites for joining, and any student with an interest in arts & music is welcome to participate. All members hold equal status within the club, with no hierarchy or distinctions between members.

Article 4: Officers

The officers of the Performance, Arts, & Music Club will include the following positions:

- President: Responsible for overseeing all club operations, representing the club in dealings with ASCMA, organizing meetings and events, and ensuring the club adheres to its purpose and guidelines.
- Vice President: Assists the President in managing the club's activities and takes on leadership duties in the absence of the President. The Vice President also helps with organizing events and supporting members.
- Treasurer: Manages the club's finances, including overseeing budgets, submitting funding requests to ASCMA, and ensuring funds are used appropriately.

Article 5: Meetings

The Performance, Arts, & Music Club will hold a minimum of one meeting per month. Additional meetings may be scheduled as needed, with times agreed upon by club members to accommodate different schedules. Notifications for meetings will be sent via email or group messaging to ensure all members are informed in a timely manner.

Article 7: Amendments

Any member of the Performance, Arts, & Music Club may propose amendments to

the Club Constitution. Proposed amendments must be discussed during a club meeting, and changes can be made with the agreement of the club officers and a simple majority of attending members. Once approved, amendments will take effect immediately.
