What

Workshops to guide faculty in the creation of accessible course content

Who

Designed for Cal Poly Faculty and Staff

Why

- Create an inclusive campus community for all students
- Comply with <u>federal law</u>, <u>WCAG guidelines</u>, and <u>CSU policy</u>
- Align with <u>CSU Accessible Technology Initiative</u> (ATI) requirements

When

- Weekly in-person workshops with hands-on guidance (for document design)
- Quarterly online workshops (Options of self-paced or facilitated) 2 per quarter
- Available at your request for your department faculty

Where

- CTLT meeting spaces in the Kennedy Library or a location of your choice
- Online via PolyLearn

Workshop descriptions

1. Accessible Document Design (in-person or online)

Step-by-step hands-on guidance to create an accessible Word document and convert to accessible PDF. 90-minutes. Focus on creating an accessible syllabus.

- 2. Creating Accessible Course Materials (online only choice of facilitated or self-paced)
 Online workshop (4-week duration or self-paced): Create accessible course content:
 - PolyLearn content using the text editor
 - Documents and presentations (Word, PDF, Excel, PowerPoint, InDesign)
 - Video creation and captioning
 - Accessibility Action Plan: Culminating activity; faculty choose one course topic to review materials for accessibility, and create a plan for revisions and improvements
