New Major Development

Tourism and Hospitality Management Major: Submitted for Approval for implementation Fall 2019. Tourism and Hospitality Management is a multi-trillion-dollar industry that employs over 5 million people in the United States and supports about 313 million jobs internationally. Utilizing experiential learning and corporate connections in Nashville, TN and surrounding communities, the Tourism and Hospitality (THM) major provides hands-on experience with unique professional exposure. The THM degree prepares students for a wide variety of careers such as travel and

tourism services, food and beverage services, entertainment, concerts and festivals, travel transportation, hotel and resort industries, cruise industry, events and attractions, corporate travel, and event planning. THM students can choose from three specializations: Tourism Management, Hospitality Management and Event Planning.

New Course Development for THM Major - Submitted for Approval March 2018 for implementation Fall 2019.

THM 4210: Customer Service in Tourism and Hospitality. Prepares students to meet and exceed customers' expectations within the tourism and hospitality industry. Review of customer service philosophy, theory, and techniques. Services quality issues, service design and delivery, customer interaction systems, complaint handling and service recovery, customer relationships, and customer loyalty are addressed. (3 credits).

THM 4220: International Tourism. Examination of international travel and tourism issues and trends, travel challenges, demand, popular destinations, safety, and international travel and tourism organizations. Utilizing current international tourism statistics to identify and analyze current industry trends. (3 credits).

New Course Development

LSTS/THM 4200: The Hospitality & Hotel Industry: (Approved November 2017; Implemented Spring 2018). This course provides substantial in-depth examination of the principals, theories and practices of the Hospitality and Hotel Industry. Specifically, this course will critically examine the managerial practice, marketing, human resources, budgeting and career components of: hotel/lodging, resorts, restaurants, catering and food and beverage services in the Hospitality and Hotel Industry. This course will also place emphasis on developing analytical, decision making, leadership, and communication skills. The course will provide knowledge and skills for industry standards to ensure students are prepared to compete in this multifaceted industry.

LSTS/THM 3100: Introduction to Tourism & Hospitality: (Approved April 2017/Implemented Fall 17). This course provides an introduction of the structure and scope of the travel/tourism and hospitality industry, the largest employment national employment base in private industry. The tourism and hospitality industry encompass: lodging, travel, tourism, recreation, amusements, attractions, resorts, restaurants, food and beverage service. The course will provide knowledge and skills for industry standards to ensure students are prepared to compete in this multifaceted industry.

MT Engage Certification: LSTS 3530 and LSTS 3010, Summer 18.

Accelerated Bachelor's to Master's Program (ABM): Designed/Approved Fall 2014; Implemented Spring 2015.

EXL Certification for LSTS Degree: Approved/Implemented April 2015.

LSTS 4520: The Sport Agent (Approved November 2014): This course is designed to introduce the student to the principles, dynamics and realities of the sport agent industry. A theoretical foundation, working understanding, and subsequent application of these principles will provide a unique vantage point in the understanding of addressing various aspects of the industry of sport agents. The course will provide insight into the history and legal foundations of sports representation, the evolution of the industry, the business of competition for clients, common pitfalls of both representatives and clients, a wide array of ethical issues, the laws that govern the industry, the structures and language of contracts, negotiation tactics, and sport-specific information. Students will leave the course with a clear understanding of the role of sport agents and the additional steps necessary to become a sport agent.

LSTS 4903: Internship in Sport Studies: Created 2006/2007; Approved June 2007, Implemented spring 2008.

LSTS 4904: Internship in Tourism Studies: Created 2006/2007; Approved June 2007, Implemented spring 2008.

LSTS 3150: Foundations of Sport Industry (Created Summer 2013; Approved October 2013/Implemented Spring 2014): Introduction to the dynamics of the sport industry field. Theoretical foundation and subsequent application are discussed to address the various aspects of the sport industry profession. Provides a clear understanding of the role of sport industry professional. Specifically, the sport industry, ethical concerns, risk management, marketing, economics, and the supervision of sporting industry.

LSTS 4110: Youth Sport Programming & Administration (Created 2006/2007; Approved June 2007, implemented fall 2007): Exploration and examination of youth sport history, philosophy, developmental stages of youth, sport management and programming, and current issues and events necessary to deliver youth sport activities within a variety of settings, agencies and/or organizations. This course will address the various learning stages of youth sport and the impact these experiences can have on youth.

LSTS 4550: Business Applications in Leisure Services (Created 2006/2007; Approved June 2007, implemented spring 2008): Application of public relations, customer service, marketing principles, and financial management of leisure service delivery systems; including procedures for developing marketing and budget plans for leisure services. Emphasis is on public and customer relations, organizing and analyzing the marketing process and budgeting.
