

## Sexual Misconduct, Dating or Domestic Violence, and Stalking Reports

Consistent with California State University Systemwide Executive Order 1095 (EO 1095), Cal Poly documents all reports (including reports from mandated employee reporters) of possible sexual misconduct, dating or domestic violence and stalking. Reports are collected and analyzed together for various purposes, including to determine if more information can be gathered regarding the particulars of each including identities, to inform an appropriate response. Reports may be vague (i.e. someone saw something they thought might be sexual misconduct in passing in a certain location but does not know the identity of the person(s) or whether they are related in any way to the University).

For reporting purposes and consistent with EO 1095, each allegation of either sexual misconduct, dating or domestic violence, and stalking is counted as one report (i.e. a report of someone subjected to both sexual misconduct and stalking is counted as two reports (one sexual misconduct and one stalking)).

Duplicate/multiple reports of the same incident from different reporters are each counted as one for reporting purposes (i.e. a highly publicized incident may be reported multiple times by students and then by mandatory reporter employees who then hear about it from students through the course of their work).

Under EO 1095, reports or complaints of other forms of discrimination, including covered protected status harassment or different treatment and disability and religious accommodations are not included in this data set.

FY 17-18 Sanctions: x2 expulsion; x1 probation and training; x1 student chose to not reenroll.
