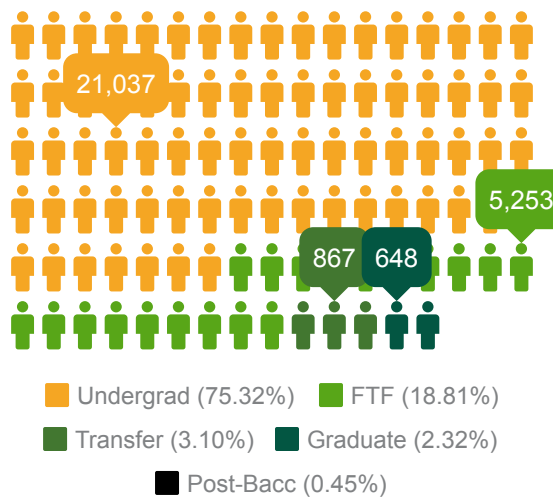

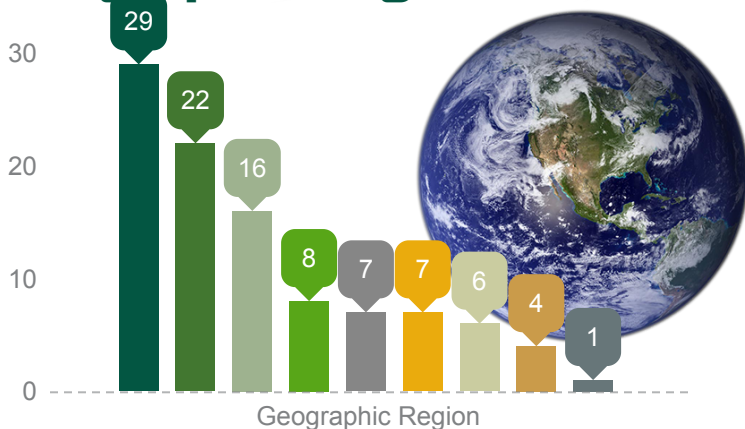

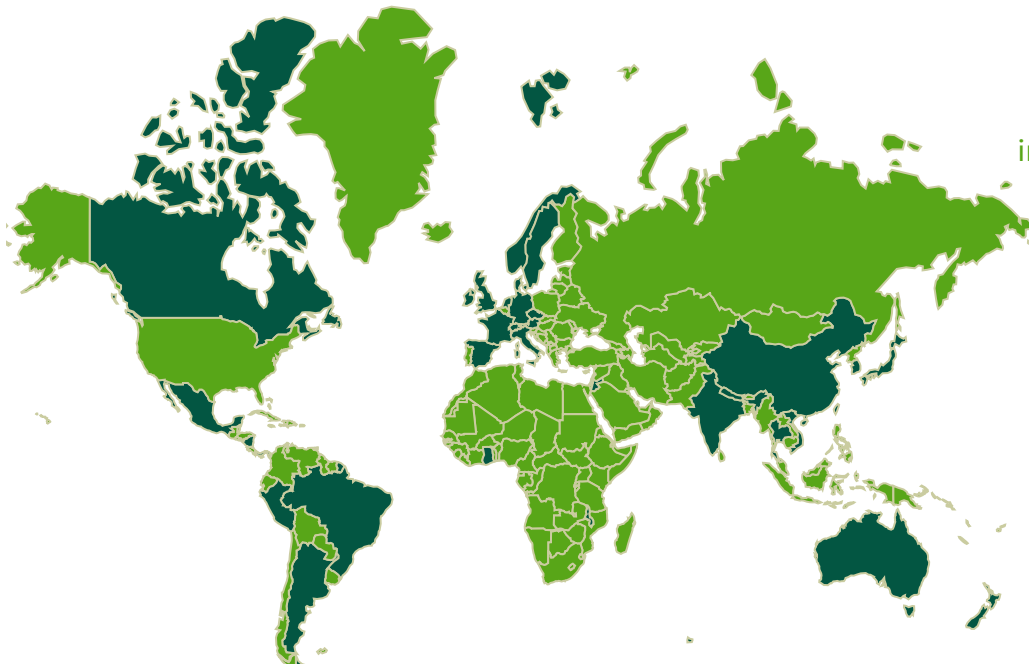

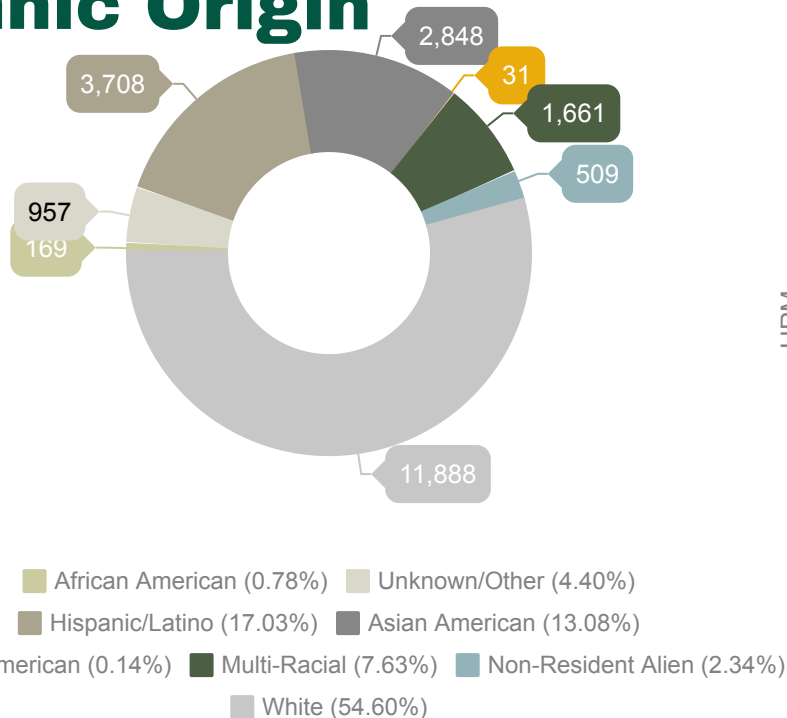

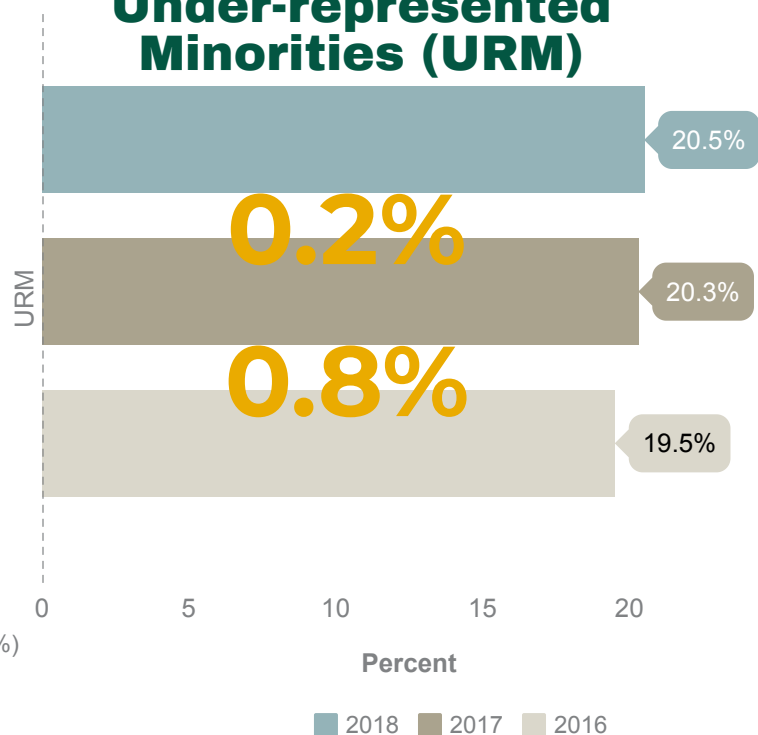

Average Student Age

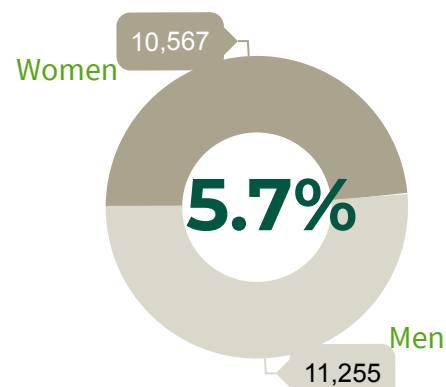

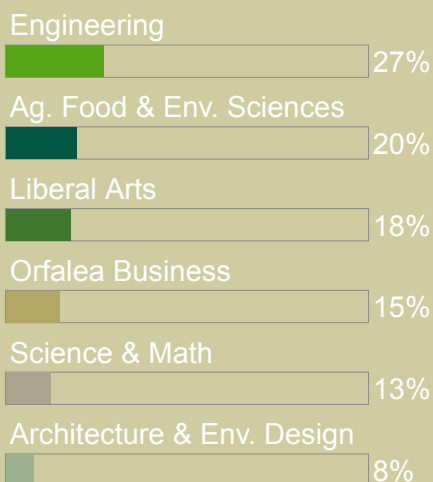

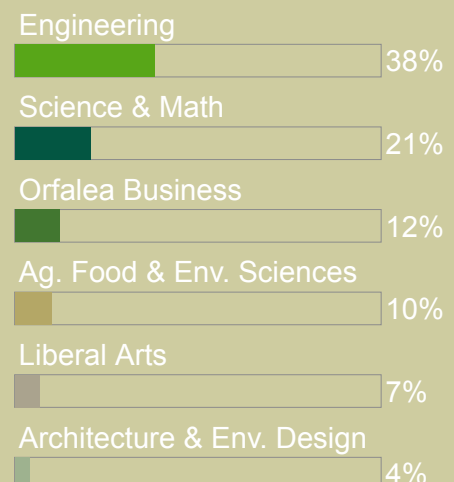

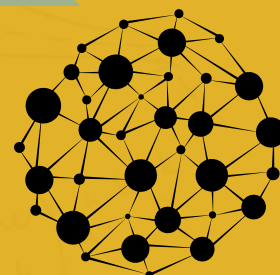
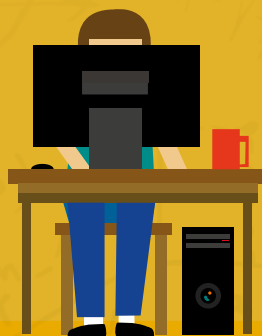

Retention & Persistence to Graduation

The one-year retention rate for fall 2017 cohort shows a decrease of 0.1 percentage points as compared to the previous year.

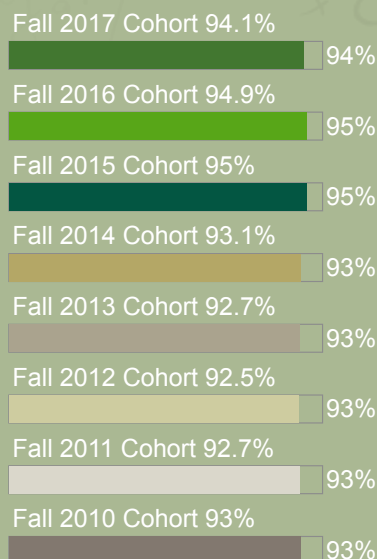
The six-year graduation rate of 82.1% for fall 2012 cohort is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from last year.

Note: Cohorts used for retention and graduation rates are based on the federal "Student Right-to-Know Act" methodology, which is defined as any student entering post-secondary education for the first time in fall term (or the preceding summer term) who is enrolled as full-time in the fall.
