# **Applications for Fall 2008**

There was an all-time high of 39,026 total applications for Fall 2008. This number has been increasing since a low of 13,441 in Fall 1993. This increase is driven almost entirely by first-time freshmen (FTF) applications, which totaled 33,352. This is also an all-time high and is an increase of 10.5% over last year.

There were 3,450 early decision applications for Fall 2008, of which 871 students were selected and 695 (79.8%) enrolled.

Cal Poly received 4,455 new transfer applications in Fall 2008. New transfer applications are up 6.6% from last year.

Cal Poly received 991 postbaccalaureate/graduate applications in Fall 2008, an increase of 7.1% from last year.

### **Enrollment**

Cal Poly enrolled 19.471 students in Fall 2008. Of these students, 18,516 (95.1%) were undergraduates, 167 (0.9%) were post-baccalaureate students, and 788 (4.0%) were graduate students. The Fall total enrollment of 19,471 is an decrease of 1.6% (306 students) from Fall of 2007.

Fall 2008 total headcount enrollment fell short of Cal Poly's internal headcount target of 19,501 by 30 students. Fall 2008 undergraduate headcount was 32 students below Cal Poly's internal undergraduate headcount target of 18,548. Fall 2008 post-baccalaureate headcount exceeded its internal target by 3 students, and graduate enrollment fell short of its target by 1 student.

Cal Poly enrolled a new first-time freshman class of 3,501 students in Fall 2008, which was 99.4% of Cal Poly's internal FTF target of 3,522. The Fall 2008 new transfer class of 700 students was higher than Cal Poly's internal new transfer target by 164 students.

The average load for all students in Fall 2008 was 14.14, with undergraduates carrying a load of 14.27, post-baccalaureate students carrying a load of 13.24, and graduate students carrying 11.29. This total student average load of 14.14 is up from last year's load of 13.97.



Over one quarter (28.8%) of Fall 2008 new first-time freshmen (FTF) came from the San Francisco Bay area. Another 23.2% of Fall 2008 new FTF came from the Los Angeles area. The top "feeder" counties for Fall 2008 new FTF were Los Angeles (10.3%), San Diego (8.1%), and Orange (8.1%). The Central Coast area accounted for 9.1% of Fall 2008 new FTF, with 4.5% from San Luis Obispo County.

### Study Abroad

In Fall 2008, 60 Cal Poly students studied in 12 countries as part of the California State University International Programs. Students participating represented a variety of disciplines, and most enrolled in intensive language study at their host universities.

As part of the National Student Exchange program (the only nationwide domestic student exchange program), 9 Cal Poly students studied at other universities across the United States. Cal Poly hosted 11 NSE students during 2008-09.

In Fall 2008, 46 students participated in international exchanges to various countries: Australia, Brazil, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Norway, Sweden, and Taiwan. Other exchange sites are located in Austria, Canada,

China, Honduras, Mexico, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom.

Additional study abroad opportunities include the: Australia Study Program, Cal Poly at Sea Program, Summer Study in London Program, Thai Study Program, Peru Study Program, Valladolid Fall Studies Program in Spain, and extended field trips led by Cal Poly faculty (e.g., Beijing, London, Tokyo, and Barcelona).

Finally, Cal Poly sent students on the following affiliated study abroad programs during Fall 2008: AustraLearn (23), Cultural Experiences Abroad (88), Danish Institute for Study Abroad (1), and University Studies Abroad Consortium (47). Fifty Cal Poly students are enrolled in independent study abroad programs.

# **International Students**

In Fall 2008, Cal Poly enrolled 154 international students, including 135 undergraduates, 7 post-baccalaureates, and 12 graduate students. These students came from 41 countries. The 5 countries sending the most students to Cal Poly were Germany (14), Japan (14), France (12), Korea (12), and Sweden (11).

#### There were 8,509 women (43.7%) and 10,962 men (56.3%) enrolled at Cal Poly in Fall 2008. The proportion of women is up from the Fall 2007 proportion of 43.3%.

Among post-baccalaureate students, women outnumbered men. Of Fall 2008 postbaccalaureate students. 68.3% were female. However, at the graduate level, men outnumbered women. Of Fall 2008 graduate students, 58.0% were male.

Of Fall 2008 students, 24.2% identify themselves as "Non-White." This is an increase from last year's proportion of 23.9%. The proportion of "White" students increased slightly from last year. The proportion of students of Hispanic/Latino origin increased from 10.7% last year to 11.3% in Fall 2008. The "Unknown/Other" proportion, which includes "No Response" identification, is the lowest since prior to Fall 1995 (before the effects of Prop. 209 were realized).

- 24.3% of Fall 2008 undergraduates are "Non-White."
- 12.6% of Fall 2008 postbaccalaureate students are "Non-White."
- 22.5% of Fall 2008 graduate students are "Non-White."


### **Financial Aid**

Of the 19,777 total students enrolled in Fall 2007, 45.8% received some type of financial aid during 2007-08. Similarly, 45.3% of Fall 2007 undergraduates and 48.5% of Fall 2007 first-time freshmen received some form of financial aid in 2007-08.

The amount of financial aid awarded in 2007-08 totaled almost \$90 million, an increase of 6.3% over 2006-07. Of this \$90 million, 70.7% came from federal funds, while 13.9% came from state and 6.2% came from institutional funds.

Of 2007-08 financial aid, 62.6% came in the form of loans, 26.3% was grants, and 7.5% was scholarships.

# Housing

The 3,641 bachelor's degrees awarded in 2007-08 is a 0.8% decrease from last years' total of 3,670 bachelor's degrees awarded. The number of master's degrees awarded in 2007-08 (435) is 16 fewer than last year but higher than the previous three years.

The College of Engineering awarded the most bachelor's degrees among the colleges in 2007-08 with 780 (21.4%). The College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences and the College of Liberal Arts followed with 751 (20.6%) and 747 (20.5%) bachelor's degrees awarded, respectively.

The College of Engineering awarded the highest number of master's degrees with 149 (34.3%).

# Fields of Study

Cal Poly offers 66 bachelor's degree programs, including a new five-year pilot program of BA in Liberal Arts and Engineering Studies.

At the graduate level, Cal Poly offers 27 master's degree programs with the addition of an MS in Polymers and Coatings Science. Cal Poly also offers an Ed.D. degree in Educational Leadership in conjunction with UC Santa Barbara.

In addition to the degree programs, Cal Poly also offers 67 minors and 14 credential programs.

Eleven bachelor's and eight master's programs are unique to Cal Poly among the California State University system campuses.

Cohorts used for retention and graduation rates are based on the federal "Student Right to Know Act" methodology, which is defined as any student entering post-secondary education for the first time in Fall term (or the preceding Summer term) who is enrolled as full-time in the Fall.

The Fall 2007 cohort's one-year retention rate of 89.2% is a slight decline from the previous year's rate. The most recent six-year graduation rate for the Fall 2002 cohort is at 71.9%, the highest point on record. This rate is 5.3% higher than the six-year rate for the Fall 1995 cohort and 13.4% higher than the sixyear rate for the Fall 1990 cohort.
