








DAVID KIRBY FEATURED IN CAL POLY MAGAZINE


MUSTANG FILM SOCIETY

On November 4, 2025, California voters will go to the polls to vote on Proposition 50 (The Election Rigging Response Act). If approved, the new law would implement the temporary use of new congressional district maps through 2030. Then in 2031, the (nonpartisan) Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission would resume drawing congressional district maps. The map drawn in Proposition 50 is a Democratic gerrymandering intended to offset the Republican-favored gerrymander in Texas.

The panel is designed to be an opportunity to engage students in conversations about voting, representation, and redistricting in a timely way so that everyone can become more informed about what is happening politically in California.


