

### Some Puzzles re: Sex, Gender, and Race-and correlated isms

Much philosophy presupposes that personal or social identities can be analyzed through the same philosophical lens. In this talk, I will argue that we have good reasons to think that this is clearly not the case, before zooming in on some puzzles arising when we try to give a philosophical account of sexual/gender identity, sexual orientation, and racialization, including their correlated isms. This diversity in our accounts of such categories, I argue, is important not only for understanding these aspects of ourselves, but also as we take on the difficult challenges of transforming our inherited legal and political institutions into better ones.

Philosophy Talk - Some Puzzles re: Sex, Gender, and Race--and correlated isms

We are excited to host a talk on campus by **Helga Varden**, Professor of Philosophy, Political Science, and Women's and Gender Studies at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champagne

(https://philosophy.illinois.edu/directory/profile/hvarden). Helga has written extensively on Kantian ethics and political philosophy, and on topics related to sex and gender. Her recent book Sex, Love, and Gender: A Kantian Theory (Oxford, 2020) won the North American Kant Society's 2023 Senior Scholar Prize for the best Kant book published in the years 2020, 2021, and 2022. She's a friend whose work I've admired for a while, and we are very excited to host her in person!

The title of her talk is "Some Puzzles re: Sex, Gender, and Race--and correlated isms" (see below for the abstract). The event will be held on **Friday**, **February 2**, **from 12:10-2pm** (two weeks from this Friday) in **Erhardt 010-220**. The talk itself should not last more than an hour, leaving plenty of time for Q&A. Please contact me directly for more information.

#### Abstract:

Much philosophy presupposes that personal or social identities can be analyzed through the same philosophical lens. In this talk, I will argue that we have good reasons to think that this is clearly not the case, before zooming in on some puzzles arising when we try to give a philosophical account of sexual/gender identity, sexual orientation, and socialization, including their correlated isms. #### WHAT IS CAL POLY U-RISE?

U-RISE at Cal Poly will provide research opportunities to students from underrepresented groups and develop their identities as scientists. Students will leave inspired and prepared for success in graduate school in the biomedical field.

Students in the program will receive tuition assistance (~\$7,500/year for two years), an annual stipend (~\$14,000/year) for completing ~10-15 hours/week on research, and a paid 10-week summer research experience.

U-RISE at Cal Poly consists of four key components over a 2-year training program:

- 1. A mentoring team and individual development planning
- 2. Mentored research experiences at Cal Poly and at another research-intensive university
- 3. Formal coursework to support students' development as scientists
- 4. Events outside the classroom (e.g., research seminars, professional development, team building, peer mentoring)

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Full-time undergrad Cal Poly student
- Cumulative GPA of at least 2.5
- US Citizen, permanent resident, or non-citizen national
- Commitment to pursuing a PhD or MD/PhD in biomedical field
- At least two years from graduating or have at 90+ units
- Meet 1 of the NIH definitions for underrepresented population: underrepresented minorities, first generation college going, pell grant eligible, individuals with disabilities


#### **Interested in Sustainable Global Development?**
