SCULD Summer Teaching Positions Available!

San Luis Coastal Unified School District is looking for qualified candidates to teach or be activity leaders in their Summer Experience Program. This may be a great opportunity for students who are currently enrolled in the Cal Poly teacher credentialing program to gain some practical experience and establish collegial relationships with existing SLCUSD staff. Students majoring in other subjects are also encouraged to apply. **SLCUSD has credential required teacher positions** (for those expected to complete the program in June - \$41/hour) and non credential required activity leader positions (\$30/hour) for those who will not yet have a credential.

WHAT IS CAL POLY U-RISE?

U-RISE at Cal Poly will provide research opportunities to students from underrepresented groups and develop their identities as scientists. Students will leave inspired and prepared for success in graduate school in the biomedical field.

Students in the program will receive tuition assistance (~\$7,500/year for two years), an annual stipend (~\$14,000/year) for completing ~10-15 hours/week on research, and a paid 10-week summer research experience.

U-RISE at Cal Poly consists of four key components over a 2-year training program:

- 1. A mentoring team and individual development planning
- 2. Mentored research experiences at Cal Poly and at another research-intensive university
- 3. Formal coursework to support students' development as scientists
- 4. Events outside the classroom (e.g., research seminars, professional development, team building, peer mentoring)

ELIGIBILITY

- Full-time undergrad Cal Poly student
- Cumulative GPA of at least 2.5
- US Citizen, permanent resident, or non-citizen national
- Commitment to pursuing a PhD or MD/PhD in biomedical field
- At least two years from graduating or have at 90+ units
- Meet 1 of the NIH definitions for underrepresented population: underrepresented minorities, first generation college going, pell grant eligible, individuals with disabilities

This is a great opportunity to take upper division GE courses (prerequisites waived) and experience London and environs, which is one of the world's great cultural and economic centers. Civic Tech Fellowship Opportunity - United States Digital Corps

The US Digital Corps has started their application process on Monday November 6th. The Digital Corps is a **two-year**, **full-time**, **paid fellowship** for early-career technologists to serve in the federal government. Fellows contribute their skills in **software engineering**, **data science & analytics**, **product management**, **design**, **and cybersecurity** to high impact priorities across government. The fellowship offers competitive pay (\$86k+ in Washington DC) and benefits, as well as opportunities for growth and a path to a long-term career position. The Digital Corps offers inperson, hybrid, or remote work, depending on the host agency.
