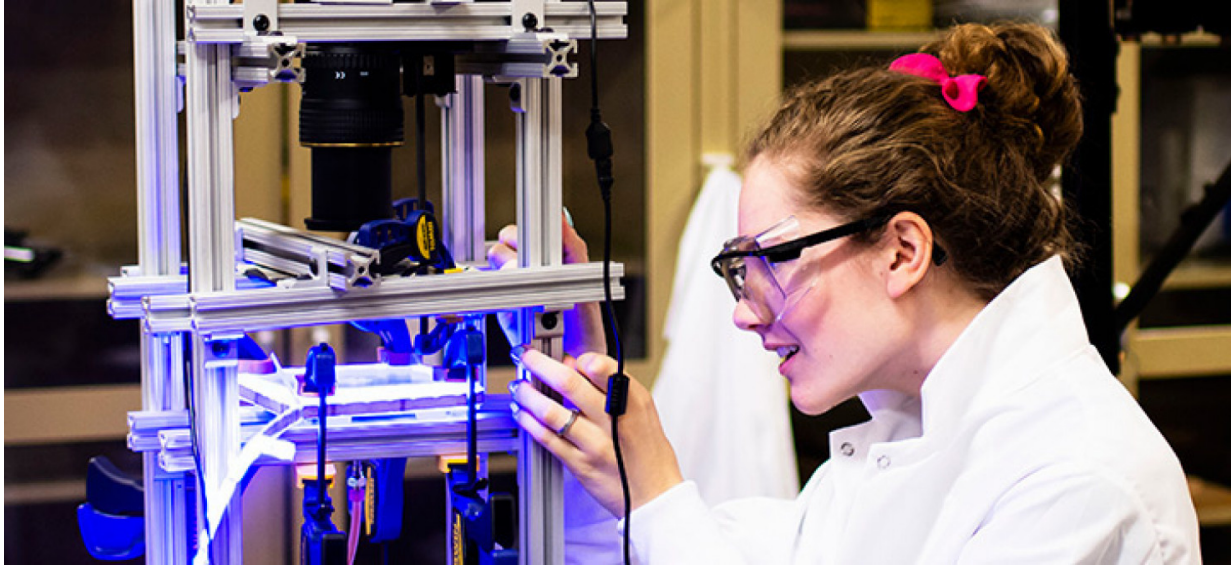

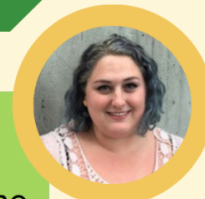

WHAT IS CAL POLY U-RISE?

U-RISE at Cal Poly will provide research opportunities to students from underrepresented groups and develop their identities as scientists. Students will leave inspired and prepared for success in graduate school in the biomedical field.

Students in the program will receive tuition assistance (~\$7,500/year for two years), an annual stipend (~\$14,000/year) for completing ~10-15 hours/week on research, and a paid 10-week summer research experience.

U-RISE at Cal Poly consists of four key components over a 2-year training program:

1. *A mentoring team and individual development planning*
2. *Mentored research experiences at Cal Poly and at another research-intensive university*
3. *Formal coursework to support students' development as scientists*
4. *Events outside the classroom (e.g., research seminars, professional development, team building, peer mentoring)*

ELIGIBILITY

- ✓ Full-time undergrad Cal Poly student
- ✓ Commitment to pursuing a PhD or MD/PhD in biomedical field
- ✓ Cumulative GPA of at least 2.5
- ✓ At least two years from graduating or have at 90+ units
- ✓ US Citizen, permanent resident, or non-citizen national
- ✓ Meet 1 of the NIH definitions for underrepresented population: underrepresented minorities, first generation college going, pell grant eligible, individuals with disabilities

Study Abroad in London Next Summer!

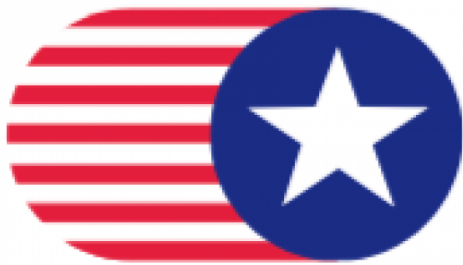
A note from Professor of Geography, Benjamin Timms:

Undergraduate student wanted for an interdisciplinary research collaboration with the Urban Forest Ecosystem Institute (<https://ufe.calpoly.edu/>). UFEI researchers at Cal Poly are investigating the human benefits of trees in the urban environment. We seek a research assistant with an interest in Virtual Reality to create realistic fly-through experiences in urban environments across a range of socioeconomic and climate conditions in CA using 3D point cloud data from airborne Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR). 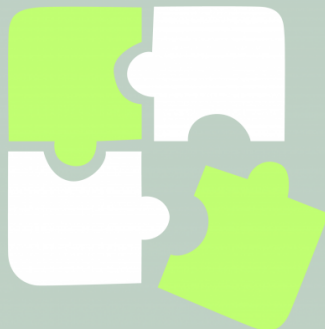
