

Many of the faculty in the ISLA Department and the STS Program will be taking part in the strike. It is important to note that striking faculty are still very invested in providing students the best possible educational experiences at Cal Poly. In fact, improving student learning conditions is one of the factors behind the strike. Additionally, faculty are taking part in this action in order to receive fair wages that keep pace with the cost of living, gain access to more parental leave, improve their working conditions, and to set a livable minimum standard for the lowest paid faculty. This is a great opportunity to take upper division GE courses (prerequisites waived) and experience London and environs, which is one of the world's great cultural and economic centers. UFEI researchers at Cal Poly are investigating the human benefits of trees in the urban environment. 


Sketch Comedy Club Auditions TONIGHT!


Interested in Sustainable Global Development?
