



## DESIGN PROCESS:

Tasked with creating a landscape that balanced the nuances of street art and parkour we developed an idea that bridged the gap between the two using a motif of culture.

Our process began with the production of sketches that defined the basic spatial qualities of the site as well as incorporating different elements of culture that defined the various axes. Developing the preliminary sketches we moved into 3d and explored the design in a more tangible manner. From there we produced various rendered perspectives that highlighted the connection of art and parkour through culture.



AREAS OF CULTURE DIAGRAM





Rooted in the idea of creating culture through art, the design seeks to give light to celebrations and groups who do not otherwise get the recolonization they deserve. While the design features various sporadic art installations that are designed to be permanent, there are vast spaces for murals to be continually updated.

Adjacent to the art gallery plaza on the northern edge of the site sit two walls intended to feature murals curated by local artists responding to the month or day that is currently being honored both locally, nationally, and worldwide. Periodic murals include art for LGBTQ+ pride month and Women's History Month. The installations are also intended to educate the younger and older demographic of the parkour park.
