Campus Parking and Transportation Advisory Committee

Function

The Campus Parking and Transportation Advisory Committee (PTAC) is an advisory body that reports to the Senior Vice President of Administration and Finance, who has ultimate responsibility and final authority for the parking and transportation programs on campus. The Committee will consider and make recommendations related to campus parking and transportation programs including alternative transportation programs and programs provided by local transit agencies that directly impact campus and its constituents.

Specifically, responsibilities of the Committee shall include:

- 1. Review existing transportation programs
- 2. Explore and recommend new programs to improve campus parking, traffic flow and alternative transportation needs
- 3. Recommend priorities for use of parking fines and forfeitures revenue
- 4. Liaison/representation of campus stakeholder groups

Membership

Committee appointments are confirmed by Senior Vice President of Administration and Finance and indefinite unless specifically noted.

- 1. Committee Chair as appointed by the Senior Vice President of Administration and Finance
- 2. President's Office Representative
- 3. Provost, or designee
- 4. Vice President Student Affairs or designee
- 5. Vice President, Facilities Management and Development or designee
- 6. Associate Vice President, Human Resources or designee
- 7. Director, Disability Resource Center or designee
- 8. Director, Conference and Event Planning or designee
- 9. Assistant Vice President Public Safety/Chief of Police or designee
- 10. Director, Transportation & Parking Services
- 11. Two (2) faculty members, nominated by the Academic Senate Executive Committee
- 12. Two (2) staff members non-MPP nominated by the divisional Vice Presidents
- 13. Two (2) students, nominated by the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) President
- 14. Two (2) Labor Council Representatives

Other faculty, staff, and students may be requested to participate on an as needed basis.

The term of office shall be:

• Two years for faculty, staff and labor council representatives with a maximum of four consecutive years.

• Two years for students. At least one of the students must be eligible for the two-year term commitment in order to ensure continuity of student membership.

Meetings

The Committee will meet quarterly during the academic year or as needed to fulfill the committee's functions. Other meetings will be at the discretion of the Committee Chair. Attendance will be reviewed periodically throughout the year.
