

**Calling All Students Interested in a  
MULTICULTURAL TRAINING OPPORTUNITY  
(Fall Quarter 2017)**

For the sixth year, opportunities to take PSY 304: Intergroup Dialogues (IGD) will be offered on the Cal Poly campus. As you may already know IGD is now offered as a GE (D5) credit, and is a course involving weekly semi-structured meetings of students from different identity groups (e.g., race, gender, etc.) with trained peer facilitators to explore group and self-awareness on topics related to cultural differences. It has been a very successful class to date!

We will be offering PSY 304 again under Dr. Jennifer Teramoto Pedrotti in Spring, 2018, but are currently looking for students who would like to train to be PEER FACILITATORS for these IGD groups. We are hoping to offer two trainings for this fall and have plans to expand our program to offer other opportunities to facilitate dialogue skills beyond the class itself. Some of these might include working with other groups on campus to help them to dialogue about a variety of topics related to multiculturalism.

The trainings will run in two-hour weekly sessions during fall quarter, and are available for 2-units of upper-division credit. If you are chosen to be a facilitator once the training has been completed, you can receive 2 more units of upper division credit for a following quarter of working with the IGD program — all majors welcome! The training will be held on Tuesday evenings in fall quarter from 6:00-8:00pm in 26-104 -- first class is Tues, 9/19.

This is a GREAT opportunity to gain more multicultural competence, diversity experience, and insight from others who are different from you! Graduate schools and employers are looking for graduates who have skills and experience in working with people from different backgrounds. Practicing these types of skills and gaining more self-awareness makes you a better candidate post-graduation!
