In many basic processes in science (and the rest of life) there is an element of chance involved, and a crucial problem is often deciding when to stop. The process could be selling your house, debugging a large software program, deciding when to retire, or interviewing for a new secretary.

This lecture, aimed for the lay scientific audience, will describe the elegant and unexpected solution to the classical Secretary Problem (also known in the literature as the Marriage, Dowry, or Best-Choice Problem), along with excellent rules of thumb, counterintuitive surprises, colorful paradoxes, and famous unsolved problems.

Dr. Hill is Research Scholar in Residence at Cal Poly, and Professor Emeritus of Mathematics at Georgia Tech, and has published extensively about Optimal Stopping.
