Dr. Leopold Selker, Ph.D., M.B.A., is a Research Scholar in Residence at Cal Poly and former President of the NorthShore University HealthSystem Research Institute, the nation's ninth largest comprehensive hospital-based research program. He has held consultative appointments with numerous foundations including the Pew Charitable Trusts, the Kellogg Foundation, the Commonwealth Fund, and the Hartford Foundation.
