**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE TOUR OF VANDENBERG AIR FORCE BASE--

On October 12, 46 retired faculty, staff and guests boarded a charter bus and headed to Vandenberg AFB. After their arrival at the Visitor's Center, Sgt. Phipps, our Base guide, accompanied them and provided an excellent narration for the 3-hour tour. Vandenberg AFB is the 3rd largest Air Force Base in the U.S. occupying approximately 100,000 acres and employing 1500 military personnel and 3,000 civilians and contractors. The base sends satellites into polar orbit and tests ICBM without the nuclear payload rockets. It also houses the launch site for Space X that is operated by a private contractor. Attendees first stopped at the Military Working Dogs facility to observe a training dog demonstration (shown below).



During the tour, attendees were able to view SLC (Space Launch Complex) 4, where Space X launched a Falcon 9 rocket on Monday, October 9. Other tour sites included SLC-6, (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Vandenberg_AFB_Space_Launch_Complex_6), where Boeing Delta IV rockets launch satellites. Between these launch sites, our group viewed Honda Point, the site of a late 1920's Navy disaster in which 7 Navy destroyers were shipwrecked.
