

## CENTENNIAL SCHOLARSHIP

At this year's June Jubilee, June 6<sup>th</sup>, the Retired Faculty and Staff Club will proudly recognize its seventh scholarship award recipient, Kristin Jochum. Since its inception in April 2000 under the leadership of Dr. Gene Starkey, the scholarship endowment reached its highest level in June 2007 (\$82,439.41) before the economy put the breaks on many investments and portfolios around the world took a downward trend. Fortunately, with additional RFSC member gifts and a positive return over the past fiscal year, the endowment is on an upward swing and as of March 31, 2010, the fair market value stands at \$78,732.76.

A form is provided in this newsletter. All funds received in this manner go directly to the scholarship endowment and enable us to place a scholarship in the hands of a deserving Cal Poly student. ## FRIENDS NOTED IN PASSING

**Fred Abitia (Industrial Technology)** passed away on April 19.

**Ray Macias (Purchasing)** passed away on April 5. He was a procurement officer for the City of Santa Maria prior to coming to Cal Poly. Ray loved music and was a lifetime musician. He played the piano for RAMS of Santa Maria and was a member of Solomon Creek Band and 3 Amigos Plus 1 Band. Ray was also active in sports and was an avid lifelong Oakland Raiders fan. He was very involved in youth sports and coached softball for many years.

**Judith Pinkerton (Library)** passed away April 3. She worked in the Kennedy Library for more than 40 years before retiring.

**Herman Rickard (Dairy Science)** passed away on May 3. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict and received his M.S. and Ph.D. from Ohio State University after returning from the conflict. He was a Dairy Science professor for 30 years and also supervised the Dairy Project and coached the Dairy Cattle Judging teams. Judging teams coached by him had many successes including three national championships.
