Your annual dues, which run Jan. 1-Dec. 31, help offset RFSA expenses. But if you're feeling philanthropic or just prefer a one-time membership fee, we encourage you to consider the association's lifetime membership option. Many of our members have made this choice in lieu of once-a-year dues. One hundred percent of the lifetime membership fee goes into an endowment the association has established to fund student scholarships. Members have the pleasure of meeting and hearing from scholarship recipients at the university's annual June Jubilee, which pays tribute to retired faculty and staff. We also encourage you to join the California State University Emeritus and Retired Faculty and Staff Association (CSU-ERFSA), a statewide organization devoted to addressing the concerns and protecting the rights of all retired CSU faculty and staff, especially pension and health care benefits. Dues are nominal, ranging from \$5 to \$10 a month depending on your CalPERS monthly retirement benefit. #### **GEORGE MURRAY (MATERIALS ENGINEERING)**

George Murray passed away March 22, 2020. He was a professor and served as department chair for several years. His volunteer work included assisting low-income seniors with tax preparation and he grew award-winning roses.

#### **EVERETT CHANDLER (DEAN OF STUDENTS)**

Everett "Chan" Chandler passed away March 23, 2020. He was the dean of students for 27 years. As dean, Chan oversaw and created many programs that all universities take for granted today, including medical centers on campus, and the Week of Welcome (WOW). He secured funds to build new dorms, oversaw the design and building of the UU and Mott Gym. Services such as the Housing Office, Counseling Center and Financial Aid were all started under his watch. Chan took great pride in creating the first Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) in the CSU system. He was honored with induction into the Athletic Hall of Fame, Distinguished Alumni Award and the dedication of the Everett and Arlene Chandler Study Lounge in the UU.

#### **JOHN RUSSELL (MUSIC)**

John Russell passed away April 6, 2020. He was a dedicated professor and meticulous musician. John's commitment to the music he taught, composed and performed inspired four decades of students. He was cofounder of the Mozart Festival.

#### **ARMANDO PEZO-SILVA (STUDENT ACADEMIC SERVICES)**

Armando Pezo-Silva passed away April 16, 2020. He was director of student academic services and the Educational Opportunity Program and a key staff member with Student Affairs for more than 25 years. Armando was dedicated to the success of first-generation, low-income students and was awarded many grants to assist in this endeavor. His enchantment with technology resulted in innovation in all areas of education and administration, including the development of the Cal Poly portal. Always a gardener and botanist, he designed and created stunning nature-scapes at his homes.

There are so many virtual tours available: Great Wall of China, Great Pyramids, Liberty Science Center, Louvre Museum, NASA Mission Operations Room, National Air and Space Museum, National Parks, etc. Below are some of my favorites:

-Monterey Bay Aquarium has live cams: Be delighted by the antics of sea otters or mellow out to the hypnotic drifting of jellies. With 10 live cams to choose from, you can experience the wonder of the ocean no matter where you are. They even have narrated feedings every weekday at 11 a.m. for the "open sea"; 3 p.m. for the penguins; Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at 10 a.m. for the kelp forest. -Cuesta College Emeritus Program (Free). Ethel Spry passed away May 13, 2020. She was the executive secretary to the ASI director. Ethel was highly regarded and loved by staff and students alike. She gave a familiar hug to everyone and a stranger to none.

#### **CLYDE HOSTETTER (JOURNALISM)**

Clyde Hostetter passed away May 16, 2020. Clyde was a professor in the Journalism Department and served as director of communications and media productions. He later produced multimedia educational materials for the nation's agricultural teachers.

#### **WILLIAM ALEXANDER (POLITICAL SCIENCE)**

Will Alexander passed away June 27, 2020. His leadership skills led him to be department head and chair of the Academic Senate. He was awarded a Fulbright Grant to teach in India. Will served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Kenya. These experiences led to his creation of a new teaching field: World Food Politics.

#### **LEZLIE LABHARD (HOME ECONOMICS AND INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY)**

Lezlie Labhard passed away June 30, 2020. She taught for 33 years in both Home Economics and Industrial Technology. Lezlie created a number of innovative programs, one of which was the Textiles Research and Testing Lab (TRTL) through which students tested textile products for industry. She was awarded the North County Patrol Station's Volunteer of the Year for her work with textiles in the crime lab.

#### **CHRISTINA BAILEY (CHEMISTRY)**

Tina Bailey passed away July 22, 2020. She served as chair of the Chemistry and Biochemistry Department and was a pioneer of women faculty in the sciences, paving the way for future generations of women scientists. On the national level, Tina was recognized for her development of the studio classroom model. Tina was active in the community, including League of Women Voters, Girl Scouts and the Community Counseling Center.

## RETIRED FACULTY AND STAFF CENTENNIAL SCHOLARSHIP REPORT

The Retired Faculty and Staff Centennial Scholarship Endowment fair market value for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, is \$149,608.

Though it was expected that only one scholarship was to be awarded for 2020-21, we were informed that there is sufficient supplemental funding to award two scholarships at \$3,000 each. On a rotational awarding schedule, the next two colleges in line were the College of Architecture and Environmental Design and the College of Engineering. Awarding activities are occur in the Financial Aid and Scholarships Office. The association will be informed of the selections in late fall, with the announcement to be published in the winter newsletter.
