Safer Programs

1st 30 Days: The First 30 Days is a social marketing campaign aimed at prevention and resource education to the Cal Poly community at the beginning of the year. Students will work with Safer staff to plan and execute a pervasive messaging campaign to be advertised around campus, and plan and facilitate individual events that will be held throughout the campaign.

Take Back the Night: Take Back the Night is a national event designed to inspire both women and men to confront a myriad of social ills, including rape, sexual violence, domestic violence, violence against children, and violence against women. The unifying theme throughout these diverse topics is the assertion that all human beings have the right to be free from violence, the right to be heard, and the right to reclaim those rights if they are violated.

Most present-day rallies offer survivors of violence an opportunity to give voice to their experiences and publicly affirm their transition from victim to survivor.

Common components of Take Back the Night rallies include candlelight vigils, empowerment marches, and survivor testimonials. The goals and specific features of a TBTN rally are just as varied as its vast array of supporters.

The student intern taking on Take Back the Night as their event, will plan, coordinate and execute the event, with the help of Women's Programs and Services and SAFER staff.

Public Relations: The Public Relations intern will be responsible for creating all publicity for Safer events. The intern must create a marketing plan for each event and develop press releases, fliers, posters, maintain the website, and work closely with the coordinators of each event.

Community Outreach: The Services/Outreach intern will work closely with the Services/Outreach Coordinator to help connect to both the Cal Poly and San Luis Obispo communities through the use of programming and implementing volunteer opportunities. Projects include a Day of Service and training sessions for new interns, volunteers, and staff.

Educational Programs: Intern will work with the Safer Coordinator to plan and implement a program that serves to educate and empower Cal Poly students. All ideas are welcome. Intern will demonstrate the ability to set and pursue goals and outcomes, work interdependently with other interns and staff, and effectively communicate to ensure a successful program.
