Aerial View Poverty Point Site (Dated 1500 B.C. or 3500 BP)












2. Woodland Period: Post 500 B.C.:


- a. Increased reliance on domesticates- first local domesticates (goosefoot, marsh elder, sunflowers)- later maize
- b. Marked increase in preoccupation with the dead- Burial mounds
- c. Marked increase in pottery

Long distance trade
































f. Mississippian A.D. 1000-1500

- v. Represented by Cahokia (and Moundville)













































Social Stratification: Societies divided into groups that have differential access to power and resources




