

PETER C. LITTLE AND LIZ CHAMBERLAIN

Peter C. Little is a professor of anthropology at Rhode Island College and author of Toxic Town: IBM, Pollution, and Industrial Risks (2014), Burning Matters: Life, Labor, and E-Waste Pyropolitics in Ghana (2022), and Critical Zones of Technopower and Global Political Ecology: Platforms, Pathologies, and Plunder (2023). Peter is also the President of the Northeastern Anthropological Association (NEAA).

Liz Chamberlain is Director of Sustainability at iFixit (and former professor of rhetoric). She advocates for repair-friendly legislation around the world, testifying in statehouses, coordinating repair advocates, and developing repairability standards. Her writing on e-waste and repair has been featured in the Wall Street Journal and Wired, and she's spoken about repair on NPR, the BBC, and Vox.


