I'm happy to announce that we have secured a room for Night One of our Social Justice Film Festival. As a reminder, this year's theme is "Migration," which I'm sure you'll all agree is very timely and important.

Night One happens on Wednesday, February 25 at 4:10PM in 33-286. "Crossing Borders: Media Representations of Migration and Justice" will feature 2 segments from a recent episode of 60 Minutes: one on Minneapolis and another on CECOT. We will also show two short films, including YES, a film by ISLA Professor Randi Barros. Following the films, Professor Barros and Dr. Melissa Manzanares will host a discussion and Q&A.




Course Spotlight: Data Are a Feminist Issue (STAT 270)

On **Valentine's Day**, the Palm Theatre will host its first Science on Screen selection, *The Little Shop of Horrors* (1986), a cult musical that turns one of nature's strangest realities into darkly comic

spectacle. After the screening, Drs. Jenn Yost and Matt Ritter, joined by Gage Willey, Cal Poly's Plant Conservatory Curator, will dig into the **real science** behind Audrey II and her carnivorous kin.


The discussion will explore how **real carnivorous plants, like Venus flytraps, pitcher plants, and sundews, evolved to trap, digest, and kill their prey**, why these extreme adaptations exist, and what they reveal about plant ecology and evolution. By connecting the film's outrageous premise to real biological strategies, the speakers will discuss how Little Shop of Horrors taps into genuine scientific fascination, **blurring the line between pulp fantasy and natural history**.

During the discussion, **live carnivorous plants will be showcased in the auditorium**.







Cal Poly Arts, celebrating its 40th Anniversary season, presents an evening with Kal Penn—Emmy-nominated actor, author, producer, and former Associate Director of the White House Office of Public Engagement—on Thursday, February 26, 2026 at 7:30 p.m. at the Performing Arts Center San Luis Obispo.

In this onstage event, presented in partnership with the Cal Poly Center for Service in Action, Penn shares his real-life journey from Hollywood to public service, reflecting on his work in arts education, public policy, and student engagement. Through stories from film, television, and the White House, Penn highlights how taking risks and pursuing multiple

passions can lead to a fulfilling and impactful career.

Penn is known for his roles in *Harold & Kumar*, *House*, *Designated Survivor*, *How I Met Your Mother*, and *The Namesake*. During the Obama administration, he stepped away from acting to serve as the President's Liaison to Young Americans, Asian American and Pacific Islander communities, and the Arts, and later served on the President's Committee for the Arts and Humanities.


