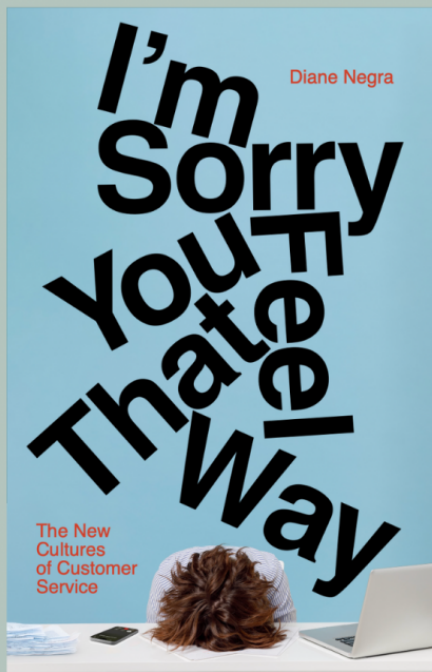

Restorative Justice Community Workshop

Restorative Partners are hosting a Community Workshop on Saturday September 12th. This workshop offers students a valuable opportunity to learn how you can contribute to the Restorative Partner mission, learn about restorative justice and practices. It allows students to learn how to facilitate and engage in programs through a holistic approach, and be part of a team that aims to make a lasting difference in the lives of individuals striving for change. Also, as the Co-Prison Coordinator for AVP "Alternative to Violence Project", the Restorative Partners also offer the opportunity to engage with our community who find themselves incarcerated at California Men's Colony State Prison. A little insight about Restorative Partners is that they partner with the County Jail, the California Men's Colony, and Juvenile Hall to offer rehabilitation programs that promote holistic transformation. Their approach emphasizes the healing of mind, body, and spirit, with a strong focus on trauma-informed care, accountability, and personal responsibility. Additionally, they provide mentorship for reentry, clean and sober living homes for both men and women, and a dedicated home for women working to reunite with their children and build a brighter future. They like for all community members to think about Restorative Justice as the lens to our approach that seeks to be curious about the person's humanity and find new and creative ways to teach accountability while focusing on reparation, restoration, and healing.

Opioid Overdose Prevention & Free Narcan Kits

Cal Poly's Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) Prevention team is partnering with ISLA to support student safety and wellness. With fentanyl-related overdoses on the rise nationally and locally, it's more important than ever to know how to recognize an overdose and respond effectively.

Join the AOD for a brief, interactive training covering:

- How to identify an opioid overdose
- How to safely administer Narcan (Naloxone)

Mawtini Digital Storytelling

Compensation:	\$1,500 stipend per project
Project Period:	Fall 2026
Modality:	Hybrid
Eligibility:	Current Cal Poly students (undergraduate or graduate)

The *Mawtini* project seeks creative, technically skilled Cal Poly students, both undergraduate and graduate, to help develop innovative digital experiences that expand access to Arab American histories of migration and belonging. *Mawtini* is a community-led oral history and archiving project that documents and shares the histories, memories, and experiences of Arab Americans living in San Luis Obispo and the Central Coast of California.

Supported through a Cal Poly [Center for Expressive Technologies \(CET\) Seed Grant](#), these opportunities invite students to contribute to public-facing digital humanities projects that combine storytelling, visualization, and interactive design. Students will work collaboratively with the *Mawtini* project director, Dr. Farah Al-Nakib (Associate Professor of History), to develop tools and

experiences that make our archival materials, oral histories, and exhibition content accessible to broad public audiences. They are seeking students interested in creative technologies, digital storytelling, user experience design, interactive media, data visualization, digital humanities, and public scholarship.

Opportunity 1: Virtual Installation Tour

In Winter 2026, the *Mawtini* oral history collection was displayed at the Kennedy Library gallery in an interactive installation that included text panels, photographs, objects in display cases, maps, and audio excerpts from our oral history collection (accessible through QR codes). The *Mawtini* installation was documented through a collection of 360° gallery images, object photography, and other digital assets. The selected student will transform these materials into an interactive virtual installation tour using Kuula or a comparable platform.

The goal is to create a navigable digital experience that allows visitors to move through the gallery space while engaging with layered multimedia content. Display objects, photographs, wall texts, and audio materials will be integrated through interactive tags and pop-up windows, creating an immersive online experience that extends the reach of the physical installation. The virtual tour will be embedded in our *Mawtini* web app (www.mawtinislo.org).

Project Goals:

- Design and build an interactive virtual tour of the *Mawtini* installation.
- Integrate 360° imagery, photographs, text panels, and audio resources into a cohesive user experience.
- Develop an accessible, web-embedded experience for public audiences.
- Document workflows and design decisions for future project sustainability.

Opportunity 2: Interactive Migration Mapping

The selected student will develop an interactive migration mapping experience using Flourish or a comparable platform. The map will visualize the migration journeys of *Mawtini* narrators from the Middle East to San Luis Obispo, allowing users to explore individual stories and routes through an interactive interface. The project aims to produce a reusable mapping template that can support future *Mawtini* contributors and potentially be adapted by community organizations interested in visualizing migration histories.

Project Goals:

- Design and build interactive migration maps for website integration.
- Create intuitive user interactions that allow visitors to explore individual migration stories.
- Develop a scalable workflow for adding future narrators and migration routes.
- Produce documentation and reusable templates that support broader community adoption.

Qualifications for Both Opportunities

The *Mawtini* project welcomes applicants from a wide range of disciplines, including but not limited to Graphic Communication, Art and Design, Experience Industry Management, Architecture, Interdisciplinary Studies, Liberal Arts and Engineering Studies, Ethnic Studies, History, and related fields.

Required Qualifications

- Current Cal Poly student in good standing.
- Some experience with digital storytelling, web design, interactive media, or user experience design.
- Willingness to learn new software platforms and experiment with emerging digital tools.
- Strong organizational skills and ability to work independently.
- Excellent communication and problem-solving abilities.

Preferred Qualifications

- Familiarity with platforms such as Kuula, Flourish, ArcGIS StoryMaps, WordPress, Omeka, or related tools.
- Experience with multimedia production, mapping, data visualization, or digital archives.
- Interest in migration studies, oral history, community-based research, museums, archives, or public humanities.
- Ability to think creatively about audience engagement and digital experience design.

What Students Will Gain

- Hands-on experience developing public-facing digital projects.
- Mentorship from faculty working at the intersection of storytelling, technology, and community engagement.
- Experience translating archival and oral history materials into interactive digital experiences.
- Portfolio-quality work demonstrating skills in creative technology, digital humanities, and user-centered design.
- Opportunities to contribute to innovative CET-supported research and creative activity.

2. A résumé showing relevant experience, including relevant courses taken.
