Following a very productive and well-established tradition the retreat will include a variety of workshops and social activities over the course of the days. For now, these will include:

- Two (2) minutes mini-introductions
- Discussion sessions focusing on dissertation / research project proposals
- Professionalization sessions for both students and early career faculty
- Workshops (topic oriented) led by faculty (TBA)
- Theory walks around campus (i.e., on the beach and hike trails up in the hills)
- Delicious meals, coffee (included), great company and conversation

Through collaboration between the Department of STS at UC Davis (which provides a subsidy) and NatureBridge the cost of this year's has been set at \$170.00 per person. This cost includes lodging, meals and Internet access. The retreat has been designed to host up to 60 participants (including faculty). Due to this restriction, spaces will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

PASA (Pro-Abortion Student Advisory) Board Application

With the passing of Senate Bill 24 (the College Student Right to Access Act) in 2019, California became the first state in the nation to require public university campus health centers to provide abortion pills to students. The law required student health centers to begin providing by January 1st, 2023, and [URGE California](#) is thrilled to continue the student advocacy piece of SB24 implementation.

URGE California is looking for three new members to join the Pro-Abortion Student Advisory (PASA) Board and invite students from the University of California (UC's) and California State University (CSU's) to apply. Joining the PASA Board is a unique opportunity to cultivate a bold and student-led vision demanding affirmative, timely and accessible medication abortion care on campus.

Students on the advisory board will have a space to strategize and collaborate when addressing issues with implementation, outreach, student use of medication abortion (MAB) services, and other campus/climate specific issues in their advocacy. Students will build upon and hone their organizing, leadership and project management skills throughout their membership.

Board membership requires a minimum commitment of 11 months starting July 2023 – May 2024. URGE will provide individual stipends for each meeting to compensate members for their time.

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Research Integrity through a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Lens Certificate Program

As part of efforts to re-focus Cal Poly's research integrity and compliance programs to emphasize how policy and procedures related to integrity have been put in place to address issues of inequitable research practices, Research Integrity and Compliance is going to be offering a certificate program for students in Winter and Summer quarters. The certificate program will be a hybrid program involving some minimal readings, videos, and cross disciplinary interactions between students as they discuss their projects and equity and diversity within their research and would meet bi-weekly. This first year will also be offering participation stipends to students of at least \$150.
